RURAL FIRES ACT 1997

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 99

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by section 99 of the Rural Fires Act 1997, I, PHILIP KOPERBERG, Commissioner of N.S.W. Rural Fire Service, under delegation and dated 22nd October 1997 from the Hon BOB DEBUS, Minister for Emergency Services, do, by this notification, direct that the lighting, maintenance or use of all fires in the open air, with the exception of the classes of fire as specified in Schedules 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14 and 15 hereto, is prohibited in the parts of the State set out in Schedule A hereto, from 07:30 on 25th December 2002 to midnight on 25th December 2002.

SCHEDULE 1

Fire lit, maintained or used for the purpose of suppressing or controlling any existing bush fire where such fire is lit, maintained or used under the direction of the Commissioner of the N.S.W. Rural Fire Service, any officer of the N.S.W. Fire Brigade, any officer authorised by the Forestry Commission of New South Wales, any officer authorised by the Director of National Parks and Wildlife Service, or any Fire Control Officer, Captain, Deputy Captain, Group Captain or Deputy Group Captain of any bush fire brigade organised or authorised under the Rural Fires Act 1997.

SCHEDULE 2

Fire lit, maintained or used at a registered factory within the meaning of the Factories, Shops and Industries Act 1962, subject to observance of the special condition that all reasonable steps are taken to prevent the escape of fire, sparks or incandescent or burning material therefrom.

SCHEDULE 3

Fire lit, maintained or used at a hospital within the meaning of the Public Hospitals Act 1929, subject to observance of the special condition that the fire is lit in a properly constructed incinerator designed to prevent the escape of fire, sparks or incandescent or burning material therefrom.

SCHEDULE 4

Fire lit, maintained or used by, or under the authority of, a Council as defined in the dictionary of the Rural Fires Act 1997, for the destruction of garbage or other refuse at any sanitary depot provided and controlled by such Council subject to observance of the following special conditions:

- (1) a fire break shall be established and maintained around such depot to a width of not less than thirty metres;
- (2) at least one person shall be in attendance continuously at such depot for the duration of the fire;
- (3) all reasonable steps shall be taken to prevent the escape of fire, sparks or incandescent or burning material therefrom.

SCHEDULE 5

SCHEDULE 9

SCHEDULE 10

Fire lit by a company contracted for the construction of a natural gas pipeline from Young to Lithgow within the Central Tablelands, Central West Slopes and South West Slopes Weather Forecast Districts provided that adequate fire fighting equipment is immediately available to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of the N.S.W. 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Fire lit, maintained or used by a Public Authority as defined in the dictionary of the Rural Fires Act 1997, for the disposal of waste or putrescent material likely to cause a health hazard subject to observance of the special condition that the fire is lit in a properly constructed incinerator designed to prevent the escape of fire, sparks or incandescent or burning material therefrom.

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SCHEDULE 8

Fire lit by the Roads and Traffic Authority of New South Wales or its contractors for the purpose of heating bitumen in tankers, sprayers, storage units, mobile asphalt plants, mobile asphalt pavers and pavement recycling machines for road repair and construction activities subject to the observance of a special condition that adequate fire fighting equipment to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of the Rural Fire Service, or his nominee, is immediately available to prevent the escape of any such fire under circumstances as to cause or to be likely to cause injury or damage to any person or the land or property of the Crown or a Public Authority as defined in the Rural Fires Act 1997, or any other person.

- (b) no combustible material of any kind is allowed within three metres of the appliance when it is operating;
- (c) a system of applying an adequate stream of water to the appliance and its surrounds is available for immediate and continuous use; and
- (d) where the appliance is not on premises containing a permanent private dwelling or is more than twenty metres from such dwelling, both the appliance and the land on which it is to be placed have been approved for the purpose by the Council of the area.

Declaration of Maximum Residue Concentrations in Stock

I, RICHARD AMERY MP, Minister for Agriculture, pursuant to section 4(1) and (2) of the Stock (Chemical Residues) Act 1975 and being of the opinion that stock to which this Order relates are, or are likely to become, degraded on account of the residues mentioned in this Order:

- (a) REVOKE the Order published in the Government Gazette No 60 of 30 March 2001 at page 1674, and any Order revived as a result of that revocation; and
- (b) DECLARE the following stock to be chemically affected:
 - (i) stock that contain, in body tissues or secretions specified in the *MRL STANDARD*, more than the residue concentrations specified in the *MRL STANDARD*;
 - (ii) stock that contain, in body tissues or secretions specified in the *STANDARD 1.4.1*, more than the residue concentrations specified in the *STANDARD 1.4.1* for metal and polychlorinated biphenyls;
 - (iii) stock that contain, in meat, fat of meat, offal or milk more than the nil detectable residue concentrations specified in the *STANDARD 1.4.2* for agricultural or veterinary chemicals, but only if a maximum residue limit for the agricultural or veterinary chemical in a food produced from the stock is not specified in the *STANDARD 1.4.2* or in the *MRL STANDARD*;
 - (iv) stock that contain, in fat of meat, more than 1 mg/kg of chlorfluazuron.

Definitions

In this Order:

"metal" means metal as defined by the *STANDARD 1.4.1*;

"MRL STANDARD" means *The MRL Standard - Maximum residue limits of agricultural and veterinary chemicals and associated substances in food commodities*, made and published by the National Registration Authority for Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals being a Commonwealth authority, as in force from time to time;

"STANDARD 1.4.1" means *STANDARD 1.4.1* of the *Food Standards Code*, made and published by the Food Standards Australia New Zealand being a Commonwealth authority, as in force from time to time.

"STANDARD 1.4.2" means *STANDARD 1.4.2* of the *Food Standards Code*, made and published by the Food Standards Australia New Zealand being a Commonwealth authority, as in force from time to time.

Note. Copies of the *MRL STANDARD*, *STANDARD 1.4.1* and *STANDARD 1.4.2* are held at the State Library and the National Library. I, **RICHARD AMERY MP**, Minister for Agriculture, pursuant to sections 3(2)(a) and 13A of the Plant Diseases Act 1924:

- A. **Revoke Order OR71 under section 13A of the Plant Diseases Act 1924 made 2 December 2002; and**
- B. **being of the opinion that this order is necessary in order to avoid an adverse effect on trade of certain fruit, authorise an inspector to enter and carry out any one or a combination of the fruit fly treatments specified in this Order, for the control of the pest Queensland Fruit Fly on all land with a frontage to or access from a street which is within an urban 60km an hour or less speed limit zone in the town of LEETON.**

In this Order, *fruit fly treatments* means:

1. *fruit fly bait spraying*, where an insecticide plus protein autolysate extract is applied to the foliage of plants as a spot spray from a backpack spray unit. The insecticide is Hy-Mal[®] that has the active constituent 'maldison'. The protein autolysate extract is Natflav 500[®]. The treatment is approved for use by the National Registration Authority under Permit 5144, and
2. *cover spray of fruit trees*, where an insecticide spray is applied to the foliage of fruit trees as a mist spray from a backpack spray unit or by a powered spray unit. The insecticide is Lebaycid[®] that has the active constituent 'fenthion'. The insecticide is approved by the National Registration Authority for this use.

Notification of Order

Notification is to be given to occupiers by leaving a copy of the Order in the mailbox, or by attaching a copy of the Order to the front door, of the land described above in the town of Leeton.

Section 115 of the *Education Act 1990* provides for the constitution of parents and citizens associations and district councils. Section 115 (2) provides that the Minister may establish a district council, constituted in accordance with the regulations, for any area prescribed by the regulations.

The objects of this Regulation are:

- (a) to prescribe the Far South Coast District as an area for which a district council may be established by the Minister (clause 7A), and
- (b) to require the Minister to cause notice of the establishment of a district council for an area to be published in the Gazette (clause 7B), and
- (c) to provide that a district council is to consist of up to 2 delegates from each parents and citizens association or kindred association from within the district council's area, delegates of any such association being appointed in accordance with the rules made or adopted by the association (clause 7C).

This Regulation is made under sections 115 and 130 (the general regulation-making power) of the *Education Act 1990*.

Clause 9 of the *Motor Vehicle Sports (Public Safety) Regulation 1999* and clause 1 of Schedule 1 to that Regulation prescribe that it is a condition of all licences for motor vehicle racing that before a motor vehicle racing ground is used for motor vehicle racing or practice, the licensee is to provide the Director-General of the Department of Sport and Recreation with evidence satisfactory to the Director-General that public risk insurance cover has been effected with an insurer approved by the Minister for Sport and Recreation for a minimum of \$30 million in respect of all claims arising out of each meeting at the ground. The State of New South Wales and the Department of Sport and Recreation must be noted on the insurance policy as an insured or interested party for their respective rights and interests.

The object of this Regulation is to amend the *Motor Vehicle Sports (Public Safety) Regulation 1999* to remove the requirement that the insurer concerned be approved by the Minister for Sport and Recreation and to remove the required minimum public risk insurance amount.

This Regulation is made under the *Motor Vehicle Sports (Public Safety) Act 1985*, including sections 6 (a) and 17 (the general regulation-making power).

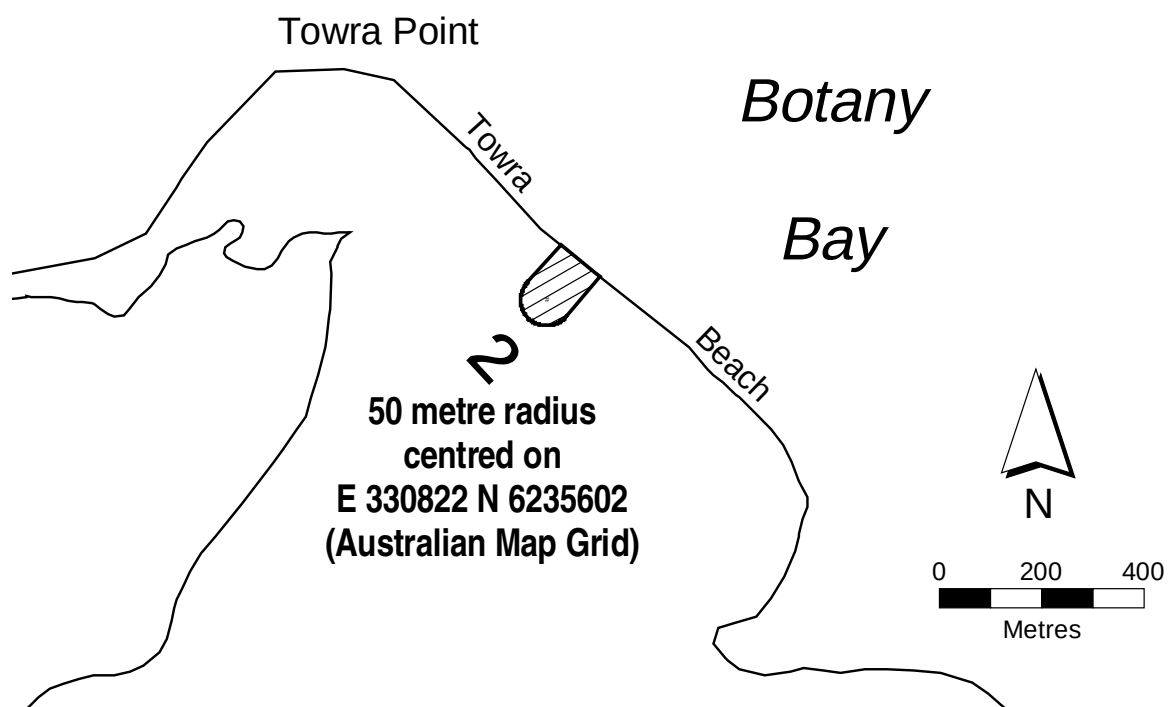

RACING ADMINISTRATION ACT 1998**ORDER****BOOKMAKER SPORTS BETTING -
GENERAL CONDITIONS ON AUTHORITIES**

I, JACK RICHARD FACE, Minister for Gaming and Racing, in pursuance of section 20(1)(b) of the Racing Administration Act 1998, hereby impose the General Conditions on bookmaker sports betting authorities as set out hereunder.

These conditions replace the General Sports Betting Conditions gazetted on 31 August 2001.

New South Wales Bookmaker Sports Betting General Conditions

RACING ADMINISTRATION ACT 1998

1 PRELIMINARY

- 1.1 These general conditions are imposed by the Minister under section 20(1)(b) of the Racing Administration Act 1998 on all bookmaker sports betting authorities.

2 DEFINITIONS

In these general conditions:

Act means the Racing Administration Act 1998.

Authorised person means a person authorised by the Minister under section 21 of the Act to perform functions such as the conduct of inspections.

Casual sports bookmaker means an authorised sports bookmaker who is limited in terms of clauses 3.7(b) and 3.8 herein.

Sports Bet means any bets or wager made with a sports bookmaker on a sports betting event.

Bookmaker Sports Betting Rules means the rules made and approved from time to time under section 23 of the Act.

3 GENERAL

- 3.1 Sports bets may only be accepted by a bookmaker holding a current written sports betting authority from the Minister under section 19(1) of the Act. Bookmakers applying to the Minister for an authority to conduct sports betting must:

- (a) be licensed by one or more of the NSW controlling bodies for racing;

- (b) hold a current NSW State bookmakers authority; and
- (c) hold a financial guarantee from the NSW Bookmakers' Co-Operative Limited for sports betting.

A bookmaker sports betting authority is no longer valid if any of the above three prerequisites lapse.

- 3.2 Subject to clause 3.3 herein, an authorised sports bookmaker may conduct sports betting:
- (a) at a betting auditorium authorised under section 24 of the Act; or
 - (b) at a licensed racecourse during the course of a race meeting; or
 - (c) at any time on any day at a licensed racecourse in an approved Sports Betting Office.
- 3.3 Sports betting is not permitted on Christmas Day.
- 3.4 A race club which is authorised to conduct a betting auditorium or sports betting on a racecourse may charge a sports betting bookmaker a fee not exceeding 0.25% of turnover on sports betting.
- 3.5 Sports bets may only be accepted on sports betting events declared by the Minister under section 18 of the Act from time to time and which are included as a schedule to the Bookmaker Sports Betting Rules.
- 3.6 Sports bets shall be in accordance with the approved forms of betting imposed by the Minister under section 20(1) of the Act from time to time and which are included as a schedule of the Bookmakers Sports Betting Rules.
- 3.7 Sports bookmakers are authorised to accept bets relating to sports betting events scheduled for determination:
- (a) up to thirteen months from the date the bet is placed (in the case of bookmakers who hold a sports betting guarantee with the NSW Bookmakers' Co-operative Limited for a minimum of \$100,000); or
 - (b) up to twenty-eight days from the date the bet is placed (in the case of a casual sports bookmaker, ie one who holds only a race betting guarantee with the NSW Bookmakers' Co-operative Limited).
- 3.8 A casual sports bookmaker is limited to sports betting turnover not exceeding \$250,000 in any twelve month period.

- 3.9 Authorised sports bookmakers (other than casual sports bookmakers) shall maintain a sports betting holding account with an approved financial institution for the holding of stakes in relation to bets on sports betting events where the scheduled date of determination is more than 28 days from the date of the bet. Sports Betting Holding Accounts are to be structured so as debits (including fees, taxes and charges) and credits (including interest) do not appear on periodic account statements.

3A Customer Debit Funds Trust Accounts (CDFTAs)

- 3A.1 An authorised sports bookmaker (other than a casual sports bookmaker) shall establish a separate account with an approved financial institution for holding (in aggregate) any debit funds lodged by customers with the bookmaker or due to those customers from any subsequent betting activity.
- 3A.2 This account is to be specifically named "Customer Debit Funds Trust Account" (CDFTA) in the records of both the financial institution and the sports bookmaker. It is to be structured in such a way that any bank fees, taxes or charges incurred or any interest received are not debited from or credited to the account.
- 3A.3 All funds of debit customers are to be held in the CDFTA. All transactions through the CDFTA are to be in accordance with normal trust account principles. That is, amounts held on trust are to be dealt only in accordance with the will of the relevant customer and are to be accounted for separately from a sports bookmaker's other funds.
- 3A.4 In accordance with the *Departmental Requirements for Sports Bookmaker Customer Debit Funds Trust Accounts* (from time to time) sports bookmakers required to maintain a CDFTA shall:
- ◆ lodge a periodic return; and
 - ◆ continue at all times to maintain at least the "Agreed Minimum Balance" in the account, unless authorised otherwise.
- 3A.5 As an alternative to holding cash funds in a CDFTA as required above, a sports bookmaker may fully or partly satisfy the requirement set out in clause 3A.1 by maintaining a *Quarantined Debit Funds Financial Guarantee* with the NSW Bookmakers' Co-Operative Ltd.
- 3A.6 In the case of stake amounts required to be held in accordance with clause 3.9 of these Conditions, a CDFTA (where established by a bookmaker) is to be used for this purpose.

4 MAINTENANCE AND RETENTION OF RECORDS

- 4.1 Sports betting conducted other than by face-to-face transactions in an authorised betting auditorium or during the running of a race meeting shall be by means of a telephone or approved electronic device which the sports bookmaker has been authorised to use by the Minister under section 16 of the Act.
- 4.2 In accordance with section 26GC of the Racing Administration Act 1998, sports bookmakers shall keep a record of each sports bet accepted.
- 4.3 In addition to any form of record required under sections 26GB and 26GC of the Racing Administration Act, sports bookmakers shall maintain the following records:
- (a) specific location where bet accepted (racecourse, office, auditorium);
 - (b) whether transacted by cash, credit, telephone or electronic;
 - (c) customer name (credit, telephone or electronic);
 - (d) time and date of bet;
 - (e) ticket number or serial number of transaction;
 - (f) details of sports betting event, including scheduled date of determination;
 - (g) approved form of bet (eg head-to-head, handicap);
 - (h) details of competitor(s) backed;
 - (i) amount and liability of bet;
 - (j) details of any cancellation, where applicable;
 - (k) daily total of bets accepted on each sport;
- 4.4 While it is preferred that the records detailed in clause 4.3 herein be official bookmaker ledger may be adapted. In the event of computer malfunction, an adapted manual form shall be used.
- 4.5 Sports bookmakers must maintain detailed records of all transactions involving the sports betting holding account and make them available for inspection to an authorised person as required.
- 4.6 In accordance with section 26GC of the Racing Administration Act 1998, records of all sports bets shall be retained by a sports bookmaker for a minimum of 5 years from the date of determination of the relevant sports betting event.
- 4.7 Sports bookmakers shall make available for inspection by an authorised person all records, accounts and documents relating to sports bets.

- 4.8 Sports bookmakers shall provide copies of sports betting records to the relevant race club or racing controlling body as required.

5 DURATION AND CANCELLATION OF SPORTS BETTING AUTHORISATION

- 5.1 Under section 22 of the Act a bookmaker sports betting authority remains in force until it is cancelled by the Minister.

6 DISPUTES

- 6.1 In the event of a dispute with a customer a sports bookmaker shall endeavour to resolve the matter promptly.
- 6.2 Under part 7 of the Rules a sports bookmaker or customer may refer a dispute to the Sports Betting Disputes Panel. Upon request from the Panel, sports bookmakers shall tender all relevant records and documents. Sports bookmakers shall provide the Panel with all reasonable assistance and co operation to facilitate resolution and determination of disputes.
- 6.3 Sports bookmakers shall abide by a decision of the Sports Betting Disputes Panel. Failure to do so may result in reference of the circumstances to the Bookmakers Revision Committee.
