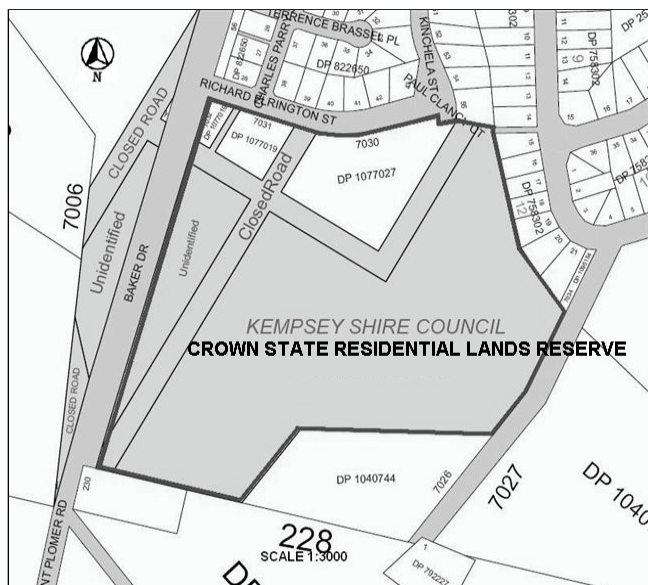

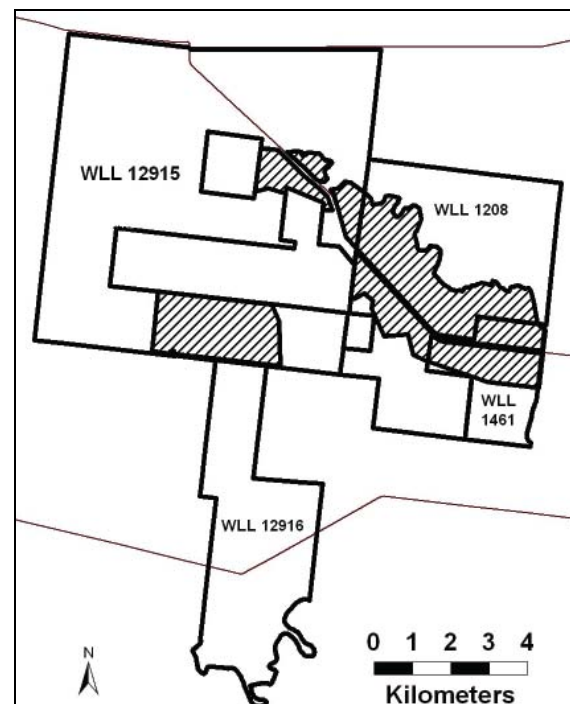

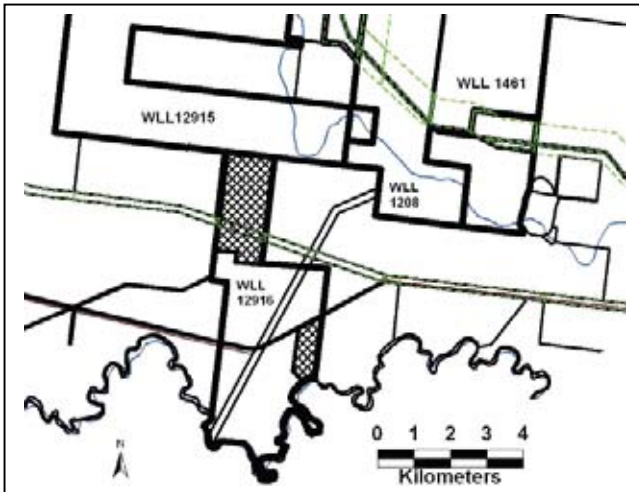

Employer Guideline 1: Do I need to do the Working With Children Check?

Employers

You need to do the Working With Children Check if you are an employer who provides certain kinds of child-related employment. For the Working With Children Check a child is anyone under the age of 18.

There are three tests that determine whether you provide child-related employment.

- Is the nature of the work “employment” as described in [Table 1?](#)
- Is the work in a “child-related” setting as described in [Table 2?](#)
- Do your employees need to have direct unsupervised contact with children to do their job as described in [Table 3?](#)

If the answer to all these tests is “yes”, you provide child-related employment. You must read [Table 4](#) to see who needs a background check, and whether you need to register for the Working With Children Check. If you do need to register, use the [Employer Registration Form](#).

If the answer to any of the tests is no, the Working With Children Check is not available and you do not need to register.

For employees in child-related employment for whom background checking is not available, use the other pre-employment checks available, for example reference checks, and general criminal history record checks available over the counter from NSW Police. Police charge around \$50 for these checks.

There is more information about recruiting safely for child-related employment in the Commission for Children and Young People’s Child-safe Child-friendly resources at www.kids.nsw.gov.au/safefriendly.

Adult household members of foster carers, family day carers and other home based carers

If you place children in out of home care you will also need to use the Working With Children Check for adult household members of home based carers. The Working With Children Check applies to people over 18 living in the home of family day carers, authorised carers (foster carers) or other home based carers. [Table 5](#) shows when to check for this group. Use the form [Adult Household Member Consent](#) for these Checks.

16 February 2010

Checking volunteers and students on placement

All volunteers and students on placement whose work is categorised as 'child-related employment' under the tests in [Table 1](#), [Table 2](#) and [Table 3](#) must sign a [Volunteer/Student Declaration](#); except those volunteers who mentor disadvantaged children in family-like relationships, or provide intimate personal care (eg bathing or toileting) for disabled children. These volunteers need a Working With Children Check.

[Table 4](#) details which volunteers and students on placement need to have a Working With Children Check. Organisations using other volunteers or placing students in child-related roles must ask them to sign a [Volunteer/Student Declaration](#).

How often to Check

You can only check each applicant or volunteer once, before you engage them, unless you are appointing them to a new position with a different range of child-related contact. If you need to make an urgent appointment, you can do the Check immediately after you make the appointment.

Checking by interstate employers

If you employ staff in child-related employment in NSW, but you are based outside NSW, you must use the Working With Children Check.

If an interstate employee occasionally has to work in NSW, the Working With Children Check does not apply. For example, a Queensland school teacher on an excursion to NSW does not need a NSW Working With Children Check.

Employer Guideline 2: Registering for the Working With Children Check

If you need to do the Working With Children Check, you will need to register with the appropriate Approved Screening Agency.

What are Approved Screening Agencies?

Approved Screening Agencies are the agencies appointed by the Government to carry out the Working With Children Check.

Details of Approved Screening Agencies (ASAs)

See [Table 8](#).

Which Approved Screening Agency should you register with?

Each Approved Screening Agency does Working With Children Checks for a particular sector. You should register with the Approved Screening Agency that covers your sector. If you receive funding from, or are regulated by, one of the Approved Screening Agencies, register with that Approved Screening Agency.

If you work across a number of industries, or are funded by a number of Approved Screening Agencies, you should register with the Approved Screening Agency that best represents and understands the industry in which the majority of your work is undertaken.

If you are not sure which Approved Screening Agency to register with, contact the Commission for Children and Young People on 02 9286 7219 or email check@kids.nsw.gov.au.

How to register

Download, complete and sign the [Employer Registration Form](#) and send it to the relevant Approved Screening Agency.

If your details change, such as your address, the contact officer or authorised persons, you must complete the [Amendment to Employer Registration Details Form](#) and send it to your Approved Screening Agency.

Employer Guideline 3: When to do the Working With Children Check

Before employing: The Working With Children Check is a pre-employment check. You must do the check before the person starts a position in child-related employment.

Once only: The Check is current while a person remains in the same position in child-related employment with you. People returning from leave into the same child-related employment do not need to be re-checked. Existing employees are only checked if they are recruited to a new position with a different range of child-related contact, within the organisation. For example, if a child care worker employed by a council is transferred to another of that council's child care positions, even in a different child care centre, the council does not need to do a new background check. However, if a council child care worker is appointed as a council youth worker, the council should request a new background check, as the role has a different range of child-related contact. .

Selling your business: If you transfer ownership of your child-related business, give the key forms relating to your existing staff - [Applicant Declarations and Consents](#), [Volunteer/Student Declarations](#) and [Adult Household Member Consents](#) - to their new employer. The new employer cannot re-check these employees unless they move into new positions with a different range of child-related contact within the business.

Filling a position urgently: In most cases the Working With Children Check can be completed within ten business days. If you need to employ someone before a Check is completed, make it clear to him or her that employment is conditional upon the outcome of the Check. You may also consider modifying the work requirements of the new employee until the Check is completed, for example by limiting access to children or providing additional supervision. You must submit an [Employer Request for Background Check](#) as soon as possible after the employee is recruited.

Short-term employees: If you are employing a person for less than six months you do not need a new Working With Children Check if:

- you have undertaken a Check on that person within the last 12 months; and
- you are employing the person in the same kind of child-related employment.

16 February 2010**Example**

An aquatic centre employed a children's swimming instructor for three weeks during January 2009 after completing the Working With Children Check. The centre is employing the same instructor during October 2009. As the centre has previously requested a Check on the instructor within the last 12 months, it is not required to undertake another Check at this stage.

The 12 month period starts from the date on the letter giving you the outcome of the Check. The person's [Applicant Declaration and Consent](#) or [Adult Household Member Consent](#) remains current during this period.

Employer Guideline 4: How to obtain a Working With Children Check

Recruitment for child-related employment

Before you recruit you should know whether the position is child-related employment.

You should let job applicants know in advance if they will need a Working With Children Check.

You should also advise your volunteers and students on placement that they will need to sign a [Volunteer/Student Declaration](#) or need a Working With Children Check.

To determine whether a position is child-related employment, first consider the types of services your organisation provides. Use the [Tables](#) to determine which jobs need the Working With Children Check and when volunteers or students on placement will need to sign only a Volunteer/Student Declaration.

Identifying the preferred applicant accurately

Before you request a Working With Children Check you must ask preferred applicants to provide documents to verify their identity. This must include original documents adding up to a minimum of 100 points as required by the [100 Point Check](#) under the *Financial Transaction Reports Act 1988*.

Certified copies of original documents are acceptable for birth certificates and for citizenship certificates, but not for other documents. Applicants living overseas who cannot provide originals of other documents may initially provide certified copies, pending submitting the originals when they are employed in NSW.

If an applicant is unable to provide documents to meet the identification requirements due to their personal circumstances or special needs, employers should contact their Approved Screening Agency for assistance.

The applicant must nominate the identifying documents provided to you, when they complete their [Applicant Declaration and Consent](#) or [Adult Household Member Consent](#). You must confirm that you have verified the identity of the applicant when you complete the [Employer Request for Background Check](#). Return the documents to the applicant once you've done this.

Getting consent from the preferred applicant

The Working With Children Check will not be completed without the applicant's consent. You must ask preferred applicants for their consent, whether they are new to your organisation, or you already employ them and they are the preferred applicant for another child-related position in your organisation.

16 February 2010

Preferred applicants give their consent by completing the [Applicant Declaration and Consent](#), which you retain. Household members of home-based carers give their consent by completing the [Adult Household Member Consent](#).

You must attach a copy of the first page of these forms to your [Employer Request for Background Check](#) or use the equivalent online processes provided by your Approved Screening Agency.

The Commission for Children and Young People or your Approved Screening Agency may require you to provide the original or a copy of the full two page consent forms for auditing and monitoring purposes. If you are not able to produce this information without a reasonable excuse you may be guilty of an offence.

Getting a declaration on Prohibited Status

It is an offence for prohibited persons to apply for or attempt to obtain, undertake or remain in child-related employment in any capacity, whether paid, volunteering or self employed.

You must ask all preferred applicants for child-related employment to declare that they are not a prohibited person, using the [Applicant Declaration and Consent](#) or, for volunteers or students on placement, the [Volunteer/Student Declaration](#). It is an [offence](#) [[Fact Sheet 3](#)] to employ anyone in child-related employment or volunteering without requiring them to disclose whether they are a prohibited person.

Who is prohibited from child-related employment

A person who has been convicted or found guilty of a listed serious offence against children or serious sex offence (whether in NSW or elsewhere) is prohibited from seeking, accepting or continuing in child-related employment. Anyone registrable under the Child Protection (Offenders Registration) Act 2000 is automatically prohibited from child-related employment. Prohibiting offences are detailed in [Fact Sheet 1](#).

Prohibiting offences exclude volunteers and students on placement as well as paid employees from working with children,

When a prohibited person may remain in child related employment

There are two situations where a prohibited person may remain in child-related employment:

1. A prohibited person whose prohibiting offence is a child-related personal violence offence, and they are in a child-related position that they commenced before 2 January 2007 (when child-related personal violence became prohibiting offence) may remain in that position, but may not seek other child-related positions.

2. Until 1 July 2010, there will be a number of workers whose roles are newly defined as “child-related employment” in the *Children’s Legislation Amendment (Wood Inquiry Recommendations) Act 2009*, namely:
- volunteers already in roles mentoring disadvantaged children (Table 4 sets out definitions and examples)
 - volunteers already providing intimate personal care to disabled children (Table 4 sets out definitions and examples)
 - licensees of child care centres, mobile child care services and home based care services
 - principal officers of foster care and adoption agencies
 - self employed persons, contractors or subcontractors in the Department of Education and Training, TAFE colleges and Community Services with extended or regular direct unsupervised contact with children
 - students on placement with Community Services

These workers, if prohibited from child-related employment, may remain in their existing roles until 1 July 2010, or until any review of their status lodged by 1 July 2010 is finally determined.

Situations where Declarations are not required

There are two situations where you do not need a Declaration of prohibited status:

- where all the children with whom the person will have contact are related to the person or the employer, or
- where they are a household member of a family day carer, foster carer, or other home-based carer.

Household members need to complete the [Adult Household Member Consent](#).

How often to get Declarations signed

The Volunteer/Student Declaration is current throughout a volunteer’s engagement or a student’s placement.

A new Declaration is required when a person enters into a new volunteer role or a new student placement with you. If a volunteer or student in a child-related role becomes a prohibited person, they must stop working or volunteering in child-related roles. You should regularly remind volunteers of this obligation.

[Applicant Declaration and Consents](#) are signed only once, before you appoint an employee. You only get another one if you are proposing to appoint an existing employee to a new role with a different range of child-related contact. The Working With Children Check is done only when you first appoint an employee. You should require them to tell you if they are convicted of any [prohibiting offences \(see Fact Sheet 1\)](#) during their employment with you.

16 February 2010

If you become aware that a prohibited person has applied for child-related employment, or is already in child-related employment, you must not employ them, or continue to employ them, in child-related employment. You may employ them in roles that do not require direct unsupervised contact with children.

In either situation you must then notify your Approved Screening Agency.

How long to keep forms

- Original [Applicant Declaration and Consents](#), [Volunteer/Student Declarations](#) and [Adult Household Member Consents](#):

Retain for at least two years after the person leaves your employment. The Commission for Children and Young People or your Approved Screening Agency will ask you for these forms if they are needed for an estimate of risk, or for auditing or monitoring. If you are not able to provide an [Applicant Declaration and Consent](#), [Volunteer/Student Declaration](#) or [Adult Household Member Consent](#) when requested, and you do not have a reasonable excuse, you may be guilty of an offence.

- Applicant's identity documents

The Commission for Children and Young People does not require employers to retain these documents.

- [Employer Request for Background Check](#)

Retain a copy only until you receive your Check result.

- Check outcome

Retain for at least two years after that person leaves your employment, or longer, with their other personnel records

What to send to your Approved Screening Agency

To request a Working With Children Check, you must complete the [Employer Request for Background Check Form](#), including all required attachments, and send it to your Approved Screening Agency, or use the equivalent online processes provided by your Approved Screening Agency.

Your Approved Screening Agency can only process requests where:

- a Working With Children Check is mandatory;
- the check is not for an existing employee, other than one changing to a different child-related position;
- you have used the correct form;

16 February 2010

- the form is completed and is signed by an authorised person
- Page 1 of the [Applicant Declaration and Consent](#) is attached, or you have used the equivalent online processes provided by your Approved Screening Agency.

Employer Guideline 5: What records are checked in the Working With Children Check

There are three types of “relevant records” considered in the Working With Children Check: relevant criminal records, relevant apprehended violence orders (AVOs) and relevant employment proceedings.

Relevant criminal records

A relevant criminal record is a criminal record of a person with respect to a charge or conviction for:

- any sexual offence (including but not limited to, sexual assault, acts of indecency, child pornography, child prostitution and carnal knowledge);
- any assault, ill treatment, neglect of, or psychological harm to, a child;
- any [registrable offence](#);
- offences of attempting, or of conspiracy or incitement, to commit any of the above offences; that
 - if committed in New South Wales and was punishable by penal servitude or imprisonment for 12 months or more; or
 - if committed elsewhere and would have been an offence punishable by penal servitude or imprisonment for 12 months or more if it had been committed in New South Wales.

A relevant criminal record includes all matters irrespective of whether they are otherwise considered spent and all relevant offences committed as a juvenile.

Relevant criminal records include charges which:

- may have not been heard or finalised by a court; or
- are proven but have not led to a conviction; or
- have been dismissed, withdrawn or discharged by a court.

A relevant criminal record does not include an offence:

- that was a serious sex offence when committed if the conduct constituting the offence has ceased to be an offence in NSW; or
- involving sexual activity or an act of indecency if the conduct occurred in a public place and it would not have been an offence in NSW if it did not occur in a public place.

16 February 2010

Relevant Apprehended Violence Orders

A relevant Apprehended Violence Order is one (other than an interim order) that is:

- made by a court under Part 15A of the *Crimes Act 1900* or the *Crimes (Domestic and Personal Violence) Act 2007*; or
- an external protection order (within the meaning of Part 15A of the *Crimes Act 1900*) which is registered in NSW;
- made on the application of a police officer or other public official for the protection of a child (or a child and others).

It does not include orders made before 3 July 1995.

Relevant employment proceedings

Relevant employment proceeding records are findings by an employer that the following conduct occurred or there is some evidence it occurred:

- reportable conduct – any sexual offence or sexual misconduct, committed against, with or in the presence of a child, including a child pornography offence;
- any child-related personal violence offence:
- any assault, ill treatment or neglect of a child;
- any behaviour that causes psychological harm to a child; or
- an act of violence committed by an employee in the course of employment and in the presence of a child.

Employer Guideline 6: What happens when there is a relevant record

If there is a relevant record (see [Employer Guideline 5](#)), your Approved Screening Agency will estimate risks to children that arise from the record. If the relevant record is a [prohibiting record](#) [[Fact Sheet 1](#)], your Approved Screening Agency will advise you that the applicant is not eligible for child-related employment.

When the relevant record is not a prohibiting record, your Approved Screening Agency will advise you of the risk arising from the relevant record, and will also advise you on actions you can take to reduce risks in your workplace and in the job you are offering.

Verifying information

Before conducting an estimate of risk the Approved Screening Agency may

- contact the employer to verify that the position is primary child-related employment; employers may need to provide supporting information such as the position description, and roles, responsibilities and supervision arrangements;
- obtain any required documents such as the complete [Applicant Declaration and Consent](#) or [Adult Household Member Consent](#);
- contact the preferred applicant to verify their personal details and confirm that the provided information relates to them.

Estimating Risk

The Approved Screening Agency uses an established framework to assist the employer to estimate risk. As part of this process, Approved Screening Agencies will:

- obtain relevant information about the applicant, the conduct and the records
- assist the employer to assess the vulnerability of the child(ren), the level of dependency of children on the position holder and the level of supervision provided;
- assist the employer to assess the adequacy of the organisation's plan for managing risks to children posed by staff.

Approved Screening Agencies may also contact employers who have notified relevant employment proceedings to obtain details about those proceedings.

The Approved Screening Agency will advise the employer of the level of risk identified from this established framework.

Making your employment decision

Once the estimate of risk is complete, your Approved Screening Agency will send you a letter informing you of the outcome.

It is your decision whether to employ a person who has been subject to a Working With Children Check. Using all the information you have, including the estimate of risk, you then decide whether it is appropriate to employ the person in the position.

If a person has been checked and an estimate of risk has been undertaken, you should consider:

- the information in the estimate of risk outcome provided by the Approved Screening Agency;
- the findings of interviews, referee checks and any other screening procedure you have used; and
- the nature of the position, including the type of contact with children and your organisation's capacity to manage risk effectively.

The safety and well-being of children should remain your paramount consideration. You may consider making changes in your organisation to make it more child-safe and child-friendly before offering employment.

If you decide not to employ the applicant because of the Check outcome

You must notify the Commission for Children and Young People if you refuse someone child-related employment because of the outcome of their estimate of risk. This includes where you decide to offer the applicant a non-child-related position.

The Commission for Children and Young People uses this information for auditing and monitoring the Working With Children background checking process. Identifying information is not released to any person, including future employers.

If you fail to notify the Commission for Children and Young People of an applicant rejected for child-related employment, the Commission may take enforcement action.

Employer obligations – confidentiality

You should provide the information that your Approved Screening Agency seeks.

Where you act in good faith and with reasonable care as part of the Working With Children Check you are protected from any action, liability or claim.

You are also under an obligation to protect the privacy and confidentiality of the preferred applicant. There are penalties for inappropriate disclosure of information regarding the Working With Children Check.

Details of employers' legal obligations relating to privacy and confidentiality are in [Fact Sheet 2](#).

Employer Guideline 7: Investigating and Reporting Relevant Employment Proceedings

What is a relevant employment proceeding?

A relevant employment proceeding is a completed disciplinary proceeding where an employer, or a professional or other body that supervises the professional conduct of the employee has found

- reportable conduct occurred, or some evidence that it occurred, or
- an act of violence occurred, or some evidence that it occurred, in the course of employment and in the presence of a child.

Employers cannot report conduct where they have found:

- the reportable conduct or act of violence did not occur; or
- the allegations about the conduct were false, vexatious or misconceived.

Employers should not report conduct exempted from notification by a [Class or Kind Agreement \(see heading below\)](#) with the Commission for Children and Young People.

Details of reportable conduct and acts of violence are in [Fact Sheet 4](#).

When an employment proceeding is completed

An employment proceeding is completed when:

- you have undertaken an investigation; and
- you have ended the investigation, either because you have enough information, or you cannot get any more information; and
- a finding is made on the basis of the investigation; and
- a decision is made as to the disciplinary action, if any, that should be taken.

Once you have done these things, the proceeding is completed, even if you have not taken any disciplinary action or the employee may still seek an appeal or review.

If the employee resigns during the investigation: If an employee resigns before you have completed all interviews and other investigative processes, you can consider the investigation “completed” for the purposes of the Commission for Children and Young People. You will need to decide whether you have enough information to make a finding that the conduct occurred, or that you have some evidence that it occurred. If you have this evidence, you must notify the employment proceeding to the Commission for Children and Young People.

If you refer to the Police for investigation: Where you receive a serious allegation that you must refer to the Police, check with the Police before you notify the Commission for Children and Young People of the matter. If the Police advise that notifying a Relevant Employment Proceeding to the Commission for Children and Young People will interfere with their investigation, you may not notify the matter. If Police indicate that notifying a Relevant Employment Proceeding will not compromise their investigation, you may notify the matter only if you have completed your investigation and found evidence that the conduct occurred.

Class or kind agreements

A class or kind agreement is an agreement made between the Commission for Children and Young People and an employer or group of employers which limits some of the relevant employment proceeding reporting arrangements of that employer. Class or kind agreements recognise the conditions of particular types of work.

Follow this link to current [Class or Kind Agreements](#).

What not to notify**Reportable conduct does not include:**

- conduct that is reasonable for the discipline, management or care of children, consistent with their age, maturity, health or other characteristics, and with relevant professional standards; or
- conduct that is exempted from notification by a Class or Kind agreement with the Commission for Children and Young People under these Guidelines; or
- the use of physical force that, in the circumstances, is trivial or negligible, but only if the employer is an agency to which Part 3A of the Ombudsman Act 1974 applies and the matter is to be investigated and the result of the investigation recorded under workplace employment procedures.

For example, do not report non-intimate touching of a child when the employee is trying to get the child's attention, or comfort a child.

Other examples of conduct that should not be reported are when an employee;

- raises his or her voice or shouts;
- accidental contact with a child;
- doesn't risk their own safety to intervene in a fight involving children;
- doesn't provide adequate supervision in a low risk situation; and

- appropriate physical contact with children in a context like sport, drama or dance classes.

Trivial or negligible use of physical force is force which is not significant enough to cause concern for, or harm to, a child. It may be intentional use of force, such as forcing a child to move when they refuse, but if it is not significant it is not reportable.

Employer Obligations to the Notified Employee**Tell them of the notification**

You must tell the employee if you notify a relevant employment proceeding involving them. The information you should tell them is in the form letter [Relevant Employment Proceedings - Employee Advisory Letter](#). You may add further information, but you should not leave out any of the information in this template.

Respond to their request for documents

Under the *Freedom of Information Act 1989*, an employee may request access to records you hold on their relevant employment proceedings. They may also ask for these records to be amended if they think the information is incorrect, incomplete, out of date or misleading. This is regardless of whether the person remains your employee. You cannot charge any fees to an employee seeking relevant employment proceedings records under the *Freedom of Information Act 1989*.

You must respond to an application under the *Freedom of Information Act 1989* within 21 days. If you receive such a request, you should release all the documents that are releasable under that Act. Schedules to the *Freedom of Information Act 1989* exempt some documents from disclosure. For example, you should not unreasonably disclose personal information about someone other than the applicant. You should also not release any information being used in a police investigation. But where that Act obliges you to release information, you must do so. You may need to release the [Relevant Employment Proceedings Notification and Summary](#) that you sent to the Commission for Children and Young People.

There are additional steps the employee may take if you do not deal with their request within 21 days or if you refuse access to information or refuse to amend records. In these circumstances, the applicant can:

- ask you to review your decision through an 'internal review'. Only an officer senior to the one who made the original decision should do this review.
- if the internal review is unsuccessful, or can't be done, the employee may ask the NSW Ombudsman to do an 'external review';

- if the external review is unsuccessful, or there is good reason not to undertake one, the employee may make an application to the Administrative Decisions Tribunal for a review of the merits of the matter. The Tribunal can make a binding decision.

You can get more advice and information about the *Freedom of Information Act* from the Freedom of Information Unit of the NSW Ombudsman by phoning (02) 9286 1000.

Employer Obligations for Record Keeping

The Working With Children Check depends on accurate and reliable information.

You must make complete records of relevant employment proceedings, and include a copy of any information you provide to the Commission for Children and Young People. You must retain this information so that it is available for use in the Working With Children Check. This duty applies despite any other requirement for disposal of records.

If the Commission for Children and Young People asks you to provide this information and you are not able to without a reasonable excuse, you may be guilty of [an offence](#) [[Fact Sheet 3 Offences and Penalties](#)].

If you transfer ownership of your business, you must transfer all records of relevant employment proceedings to the new owner.

If you sell or close your business, you should send investigation reports and other relevant records for your notified Relevant Employment Proceedings to the Commission for Children and Young People. You should sign the [Relevant Employment Proceedings Records Release](#) and send it too.

You must keep all information regarding the Working With Children Check confidential. It is an offence to disclose information obtained as part of the Working With Children Check, except

- for the purposes of conducting the Working With Children Check
- where the person to whom the information relates consents
- if a court orders it for a court hearing or determination
- other lawful excuse

Employee Challenges to Notification

The Commission for Children and Young People has no authority to investigate an employer's notification. If an employee believes he or she has been wrongly notified to the Commission, they may seek a review by the employer. Employees in sectors

oversighted by the Ombudsman [\[Table 7: Relevant Legislation\]](#) may ask the Ombudsman to review the employer's investigation and notification.

The grounds for challenge include:

- the investigation was inadequate (eg natural justice denied)
- the conduct was not reportable
- there was not sufficient evidence to report the conduct.

The Commission for Children and Young People is unable to remove notifications on other grounds, for example, that the employee has conducted himself or herself well since the matter was notified. The Approved Screening Agencies will take this information into account when estimating risk relating to a Relevant Employment Proceeding.

How to report relevant employment proceedings

All employers must notify the Commission for Children and Young People of the details of any employee against whom relevant employment proceedings have been completed since 3 July 1995.

Use the form [Relevant Employment Proceedings Notification and Summary](#) to notify these matters. Complete all the sections on this form.

You should send the notification as soon as possible after you make your findings, so that children in other workplaces are protected.

If you discover that you have notified a relevant employment proceeding wrongly to the Commission for Children and Young People, you must advise the Commission in writing, so the record can be corrected.

Both the Commission for Children and Young People and the NSW Ombudsman have a role in the notification of relevant employment proceedings. Employers subject to the Ombudsman's oversight are:

- government employers
- schools
- child care centres
- children's residential care centres
- agencies providing residential care for children.

Categories of relevant employment proceedings

There are two tiers of relevant employment proceeding. Category One matters trigger an estimate of risk when the person has a Working With Children Check. Category Two matters are only considered in an Estimate of Risk if there are additional relevant records for the person.

Category One is where the investigation finds:

- reportable conduct occurred; or
- an act of violence took place.

Category Two is where the investigation finds:

- some evidence that reportable conduct occurred, but the finding is inconclusive; or
- some evidence that an act of violence occurred, but the finding is inconclusive.

The [Relevant Employment Proceedings Notification and Summary](#) invites employers to tell the Commission for Children and Young People when the evidence of the conduct is strong (but not conclusive) and the alleged conduct is serious. In these cases the Commission may register the matter as Category One.

Changing Categories of Relevant Employment Proceeding

The Commission for Children and Young People can change the category of a Relevant Employment Proceeding where employers advise that they have notified to the wrong category and have evidence to support this, or where additional conduct from that employee is notified.

How to make your workplace child-safe and child-friendly

Organisational practices are at least as important as background checks in preventing child abuse within workplaces.

The Commission for Children and Young People has created web-based resources to help employers keep children and young people safe and reduce the risk of abuse.

These resources include templates and checklists on developing child-safe policies, codes of conduct, recruitment and selection, induction, supporting staff and managing complaints.

The Child-safe Child-friendly resources are on the Commission for Children and Young People's website at www.kids.nsw.gov.au/safefriendly.

What to do if you have a complaint about service

If you have a complaint about the service provided by your Approved Screening Agency you should first contact that Agency.

If the matter cannot be resolved by the Approved Screening Agency, contact the Commission for Children and Young People who may be able to assist you.

All of the Approved Screening Agencies, apart from the Catholic Commission for Employment Relations, are within the jurisdiction of the NSW Ombudsman. The NSW Ombudsman will be able to provide you with further information if you wish to make a complaint. Information on the NSW Ombudsman is available at www.ombo.nsw.gov.au

Fact Sheet 1 – Prohibiting Offences

A prohibited person is someone who is a registrable person as defined in the *Child Protection (Offenders Registration) Act 2000* or has been convicted of one of the following offences:

- murder of a child;
- serious sex offence, including carnal knowledge;
- child-related personal violence offence (an offence committed by an adult involving intentionally wounding or causing grievous bodily harm to a child);
- indecency offences punishable by imprisonment of 12 months or more;
- kidnapping (unless the offender is or has been the child's parent or carer);
- offences connected with child prostitution;
- possession, distribution or publication of child pornography; or
- attempt, conspiracy or incitement to commit the above offences.

This list summarises detailed provisions set out in section 33B of the *Commission for Children and Young People Act 1998*.

A conviction includes a charge proven in court. It includes a finding that the charge is proven, or that a person is guilty, even though the court does not proceed to a conviction. Dismissed charges and pending charges for these offences do not make someone a prohibited person.

A registrable person is one found guilty of an offence that is registrable under the *Child Protection (Offenders Registration) Act 2000*, except

- for certain offences committed by a juvenile
- for offences where the offender was found guilty before 15 October 2001

Registrable offences are all the offences listed above, with the exception of the child-related personal violence offences.

Fact Sheet 2 – Privacy and Confidentiality Obligations

All NSW public sector agencies, including local government organisations, must treat personal information in accordance with the Information Protection Principles in the *Privacy and Personal Information Protection Act 1998*.

A non-government organisation should also follow the Information Protection Principles in the *Privacy and Personal Information Protection Act 1998* in relation to any personal information relating to prohibited persons and Working With Children Checks that it collects or holds.

These principles relate to:

- the manner and purpose of collecting personal information;
- asking or persuading individuals to provide personal information;
- the storage and security of personal information;
- information relating to records kept by the record keeper;
- accessing records containing personal information;
- altering records containing personal information;
- checking the accuracy, etc of personal information before use;
- limits on use of personal information; and
- limits on disclosure of personal information.

You will find more information about these principles from Privacy NSW (Office of the Privacy Commissioner) at www.lawlink.nsw.gov.au/pc.

If a person feels that their privacy has been breached they should complain to the employer first. If they are not satisfied with the employer's response they can make a complaint to Privacy NSW or the Office of the Federal Privacy Commissioner, depending on the type of employer they are making the complaint about. Fact Sheet 3 – Offences and penalties

Proceedings can be brought against a person up to two years after any of the following offences are committed under the *Commission for Children and Young People Act 1998*.

Prohibited Persons

- a prohibited person applying for, undertaking or remaining in child-related employment;
- engaging anyone in child-related employment without requiring them to disclose whether they are a prohibited person.

It is an offence for prohibited persons to apply for or attempt to obtain, undertake or remain in child-related employment. A person found guilty of any of these offences may be imprisoned for two years and/or fined.

It is an offence to engage anyone in child-related employment without requiring them to disclose whether they are a prohibited person. It is also an offence to employ, or continue to employ a person you know is a prohibited person, in child-related employment. A person or corporation found guilty of any of these offences may be fined.

However, it is not an offence for a person continuously employed in child-related employment since before 2 January 2007 who had previously been convicted of a child-related personal violence offence to remain in that employment. It is also not an offence to continue to employ such a person.

It is an offence to knowingly make a false statement in response to a request relating to a person's status as a prohibited person. A person found guilty of this offence may be imprisoned for 12 months and/or fined.

Not undertaking the Working With Children Check

- not undertaking the Working With Children Check as required under the *Commission for Children and Young People Act 1998*.

If you do not undertake the Working With Children Check as required under the *Commission for Children and Young People Act 1998* the Commission for Children and Young People may serve you with an enforcement notice. It is an offence not to comply with the requirements of an enforcement notice without a reasonable excuse. The maximum penalty for not complying is imprisonment for six months and/or a fine.

Applicants rejected after a risk estimate

- failing to notify the Commission for Children and Young People of a rejected applicant for child-related employment

You must notify the Commission for Children and Young People of the details of a person whose application for child-related employment has been rejected as a result of a Working With Children Check estimate of risk. Your Approved Screening Agency sends you a Rejected Applicant Notification with the risk estimate outcome. If you fail to notify the Commission, it may serve you with an enforcement notice.

It is an offence not to comply with the requirements of an enforcement notice without a reasonable excuse. The maximum penalty for not complying is imprisonment for six months and/or a fine.

Relevant employment proceeding

- failing to notify the Commission for Children and Young People of a relevant employment proceeding

If you do not notify the Commission for Children and Young People of the name and other relevant identifying particulars of any employee (either paid or unpaid) against whom relevant employment proceedings have been completed (since 3 July 1995), you may be served with an enforcement notice.

It is an offence not to comply with the requirements of an enforcement notice without a reasonable excuse. The maximum penalty for not complying is imprisonment for six months and/or a fine.

Breaching confidentiality

It is an offence to disclose any information obtained as part of the Working With Children Check, unless the disclosure is:

- made in good faith for the purposes of the Working With Children Check; or
- made with the consent of the person to whom the information relates; or
- ordered by a court or other judicial body; or
- made with other lawful excuse, for example if you are compelled to provide information to police for law enforcement purposes.

It is also an offence to dishonestly obtain confidential information relating to the Working With Children Check.

A person found guilty of any of these offences may be imprisoned for six months and/or fined.

Failing to produce information when requested by the Commission for Children and Young People

The Commission for Children and Young People may issue you with a notice requiring you to provide the Commission with information or documents relating to the Working

With Children Check. This information is collected only for the purposes of undertaking an estimate of risk or monitoring and auditing.

It is an offence not to comply with this notice without a reasonable excuse. It is also an offence to knowingly provide the Commission for Children and Young People with information that is false or misleading. A person found guilty of either of these offences may be fined.

Fact Sheet 4 – Reportable Conduct and Acts of Violence

Reportable conduct is:

- any sexual offence, or sexual misconduct, committed against, with, or in the presence of, a child; or
- any child pornography offence or misconduct involving child pornography; or
- any child-related personal violence offence; or
- an offence of filming for indecent purposes committed against, with, or in the presence of, a child under section 21G or 21H of the Summary Offences Act 1988; or
- any assault, ill-treatment or neglect of a child; or
- any behaviour that causes psychological harm to a child,

and in any case whether or not the child consents.

This list summarises detailed provisions set out in section 33 of the *Commission for Children and Young People Act 1998*.

Conduct outside work can be reportable, if the employer has the capacity to investigate it and make a finding.

Sexual offences

Sexual offences include sexual assault, the involvement of children in sexual acts or acts of indecency and any sexual threat imposed on a child. Sexual assault refers to sexual intercourse by a person with a child.

Sexual misconduct

Sexual misconduct describes a range of behaviours or a pattern of behaviour aimed at the involvement of children in sexual acts. Some of these behaviours may include:

- any sexual relationship with a child;
- inappropriate conversations of a sexual nature;
- comments that express a desire to act in a sexual manner with individual children or young people;
- unwarranted and inappropriate touching of a child, or in the presence of a child;
- sexual exhibitionism in the presence of a child;
- personal correspondence (including electronic communication) with a child or young person in respect of the adult's sexual feelings for a child or young person;

- deliberate exposure of children and young people to sexual behaviour of others including display of pornography;
- possession of child pornography; and
- patterns of behaviour aimed at engaging or 'grooming' a child as a precursor to sexual abuse.

Sexual misconduct includes 'grooming behaviour'. This means patterns of behaviour aimed at engaging or 'grooming' a child as a precursor to sexual abuse. It is a separate offence from the actual sexual abuse. The grooming process can include:

- persuading a child that they have a 'special' relationship, eg by spending inappropriate special time with the child, inappropriately giving gifts, showing special favours to them but not other children, allowing the child to overstep rules, etc;
- testing of boundaries, eg by undressing in front of the child, encouraging inappropriate physical contact (that is not overtly sexual), talking about sex, 'accidental' touching of genitals, etc;
- extending a relationship outside the employment situation – this should not be assumed to constitute grooming where an existing relationship pre-dates the employment or where the extended relationship arises through a reasonable level of social engagement in the relevant community (eg sports coaching, family level social contact within a small community);
- inappropriate personal correspondence, including electronic communication, that explores sexual feelings or intimate personal feelings.

These behaviours are not always reportable conduct where they occur in isolation. However a repeating pattern of behaviour, or several of these behaviours together, could indicate that the conduct is grooming and is reportable conduct.

Physical assault

Physical assault is only reportable where it includes all of the following elements:

- it is an act committed on or towards a child; and
- it involves either the application of force to a child or an act that causes a child to think that immediate force will be used on them; and
- it is either hostile or reckless (a reckless act is one where a person would reasonably foresee the likelihood of inflicting injury or fear and ignores the risk); and
- a child fears that he or she will be harmed as a result of the act, though the harm does not need to actually happen.

Not all application of force is the source of real or feared harm, particularly where the force is gentle. Physical contact which is part of a work relationship is not automatically assault even if there is anger involved.

For employers overseen by the Ombudsman under Part 3A of the Ombudsman Act 1974, physical assault does not include behaviour that is reasonable for discipline, management or care of children, or the use of physical force that is trivial or negligible.

Ill-treatment

Ill-treatment of a child occurs where correction or discipline administered is extreme and excessive for the situation.

For example, locking a child in a cupboard as punishment for talking, or tying a child to a chair because they wandered, are excessive and inappropriate forms of discipline that would be regarded as ill-treatment.

Supplying prohibited drugs to a child is another example of ill-treatment.

Discipline that breaches community standards, or that may affect the long-term well-being of the child, is likely to be classified as ill-treatment.

Neglect

Neglect occurs when a child is harmed by the failure to provide basic physical and emotional necessities of life: eg, food, supervision, nursing, clothing, medical attention or lodging. Generally neglect offences are linked to a person responsible for the care of a child, such as a parent or foster carer.

Neglect can be ongoing or a single significant incident. However, neglect typically develops as a pattern of behaviour that harms a child over a period of time. For example, failing to take a child to a doctor on one occasion would not be neglect, but systematically refusing to provide medical attention for a child would be neglect. Accidentally leaving a child locked in a child care centre for a short time is not neglect, though it may be a breach of professional conduct.

When considering whether a child is being, or has been, neglected, it may be useful to focus on the effect on the child. Incidents that do not suggest any impact on the long-term physical, emotional or intellectual well-being of the child are unlikely to constitute neglect.

Behaviour that causes psychological harm

There are three elements in a finding of behaviour that causes psychological harm.

There must be:

- inappropriate behaviour by the offender;
- significant emotional harm or trauma to a child; and

- a causal link between the behaviour and the harm.

Psychological harm is typically characterised by a consistent or repetitive pattern of behaviour by the employee. Isolated or minor incidents generally do not result in significant psychological harm or trauma.

Examples of behaviour that causes psychological harm may include extended and ongoing actions that degrade or belittle a child, extended denial of opportunities to participate and develop, or extended restriction of freedom to move.

Act of Violence

For an act of violence to be reportable, it must be an act or series of related acts that:

- involve violent conduct;
- are committed in the course of employment;
- are committed in the presence of a child; and
- result in injury, either physical or emotional, to the child

An act of violence is not necessarily committed on, or directed at, a child. It includes violence to property as well as to people. However, small and insignificant actions such as throwing a book or slamming a door do not constitute acts of violence and should not be reported.

A reportable act of violence does not include acts which are trivial or negligible. While anger and small “acts of violence” are undesirable in any workplace, they are not all relevant employment proceedings for the Working With Children Check.
