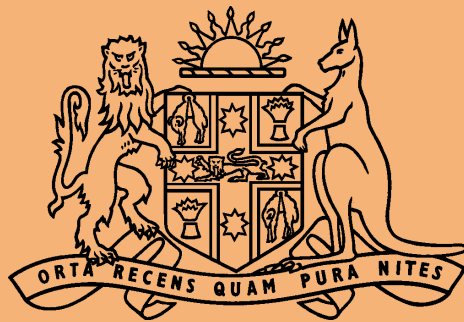

Part 1 Preliminary

1 Name of Policy

This Policy is *State Environmental Planning Policy No 67—Macquarie Generation Industrial Development Strategy*.

2 Aims, objectives etc

The aims of this Policy are:

- (a) to promote and co-ordinate the orderly and economic development of certain land in the local government areas of Muswellbrook and Singleton (the Macquarie Generation Buffer Land), and
- (b) to facilitate the carrying out of certain types of industrial development of State significance within the Macquarie Generation Buffer Land with a strong commitment to sustainable environmental performance, and
- (c) to enable public involvement and participation in the assessment of applications for consent to carry out this development.

3 Definitions

- (1) In this Policy:

Macquarie Generation Buffer Land means the land shown by heavy black edging on the map.

the Act means the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

the map means the map marked “Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 State Environmental Planning Policy 67 Macquarie Generation Industrial Development Strategy” deposited in the office of the Department of Urban Affairs and Planning.

(2) Notes in this Policy do not form part of it.

4 Land to which this Policy applies

This Policy applies to the Macquarie Generation Buffer Land.

5 Relationship with other environmental planning instruments

- (1) If any other environmental planning instrument, whether made before or after this Policy, contains provisions that are inconsistent with this Policy, this Policy prevails to the extent of any inconsistency, subject to this clause.
- (2) Nothing in this Policy affects *State Environmental Planning Policy No 4—Development Without Consent*.

Part 2 Development controls

6 Carrying out of certain development with consent

A person may, with the consent of the consent authority, carry out development specified in Schedule 1 on the land to which this Policy applies.

7 State significant development

Development specified in Schedule 1 is State significant development.

Note. Pursuant to section 76A (9) of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*, the Minister for Urban Affairs and Planning is the consent authority for State significant development.

8 Notice of development applications to be given to Councils

The consent authority:

- (a) must forward a copy of a development application to carry out development specified in Schedule 1:
 - (i) to the Muswellbrook Shire Council, if the development, or any part of it, is proposed to be carried out in the Council's area, or
 - (ii) to the Singleton Shire Council, if the development, or any part of it, is proposed to be carried out in the Council's area,or to both Councils, as the case may require, within 7 days after it is received, and
- (b) must not determine the development application until:
 - (i) it has received and considered the views of the relevant Council, or Councils, with respect to the application, or
 - (ii) the relevant Council has, or the Councils have, informed the consent authority that it does not, or that they do not, wish to make any representations concerning the application, or
 - (iii) 21 days have elapsed since the date on which the copy of the application was forwarded to the relevant Council or Councils.

9 Additional matters to be considered by consent authority

In determining a development application, the consent authority must take into consideration such of the following matters as are of relevance to the development the subject of the development application:

- (a) the cumulative air and other environmental impacts of the development and any other development (including the power stations) on the land to which this Policy applies,
- (b) the minimisation of truck movements and the feasibility of utilising transport by rail,
- (c) the efficiency of the utilisation of resources, including energy, water and raw materials,
- (d) the minimisation and management of waste,
- (e) the minimisation of visual impacts, including the restoration of native vegetation,
- (f) the likely effects of the development on local and regional societies and economies,
- (g) any submissions made to the consent authority concerning the development by any member of the public.

Liquor Amendment (Approved Gaming Devices) Regulation 2001

Liquor Act 1982

Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to limit, for a period of 3 months, the number of approved gaming devices that can be acquired, kept, or used or operated in a hotel to the number authorised immediately before the commencement of this Regulation.

This Regulation is made under the *Liquor Act 1982*, including sections 20 (2) (a) and (c1), 156 (1) and (1A), 160 and 164 (3).

Insert after clause 46:

46AA Number of approved gaming devices

- (1) It is a condition of a hotelier's licence that the hotelier cannot acquire, keep in the hotel, or permit the use or operation in the hotel of, any approved gaming device:
 - (a) that was not acquired, and
 - (b) the acquisition, keeping, and the use or operation of which was not authorised and permitted by the court or the Board,immediately before the commencement of this clause.
- (2) A hotelier cannot apply to the court or the Board to impose, vary or revoke a condition of the hotelier's licence so as to authorise the acquisition, keeping, or the use or operation of more approved gaming devices than were lawfully acquired, kept in the hotel and used or operated in the hotel immediately before the commencement of this clause.
- (3) The court or the Board cannot, while this clause is in force, determine an application made to it by a hotelier before the commencement of this clause to impose, vary or revoke a condition of the hotelier's licence so as to authorise the acquisition, keeping, or the use or operation of more approved gaming devices than were lawfully acquired, kept in the hotel and used or operated in the hotel immediately before the application was made.
- (4) This clause expires 3 months after the commencement of this clause.

1 Name of Order

This Order is the *Public Sector Management (Department of Ageing, Disability and Home Care) Order 2001*.

2 Establishment of Department of Ageing, Disability and Home Care

The Department of Ageing, Disability and Home Care is established as a department of the Public Service responsible to the Minister for Ageing and the Minister for Disability Services.

3 Abolition of Ageing and Disability Department and transfer of branches

- (1) All branches are removed from the Ageing and Disability Department and added to the Department of Ageing, Disability and Home Care.
- (2) The Ageing and Disability Department is abolished as a department of the Public Service.

4 Transfer of branch to new Department

The Disability Services branch is removed from the Department of Community Services and added to the Department of Ageing, Disability and Home Care.

5 Amendment of Schedule 1 to the Public Sector Management Act 1988

Schedule 1 (Departments) to the *Public Sector Management Act 1988* is amended by omitting from Column 1 the words “Ageing and Disability Department” and by inserting instead the words “Department of Ageing, Disability and Home Care”.

6 Construction of certain references

- (1) A reference in any Act or statutory instrument, or in any other instrument, or in any contract or agreement, to the Ageing and Disability Department is to be construed as a reference to the Department of Ageing, Disability and Home Care.

Notice of Final Determination and Amendment of Schedule 3 to Act

The Scientific Committee established under the *Threatened Species Conservation Act 1995* has, in pursuance of Division 3 of Part 2 of that Act, made a final determination to insert the following threatening process in Schedule 3 to that Act (Key threatening processes) and, accordingly, that Schedule is amended as set out in Annexure "A" to this Notice:

Loss or degradation (or both) of sites used for hill-topping by butterflies

The final determination to insert this process in Schedule 3 has been made because the Scientific Committee is of the opinion that the loss or degradation (or both) of sites used for hill-topping by butterflies could cause butterfly species, populations or ecological communities that are not threatened to become threatened.

Vulnerable Species (Schedule 2)

Pultenaea sp. Gibberagee State Forest (Westaway 924), a shrub

The Committee is of the opinion that this species is likely to become endangered unless the circumstances and factors threatening its survival or evolutionary development cease to operate.

Key Threatening Process (Schedule 3)

Competition from feral honeybees *Apis mellifera* Linnaeus

The Committee is of the opinion that this threatening process could cause species that are not threatened to become threatened.

PLANT DISEASES ACT 1924

PROCLAMATION — P115

PROCLAMATION to prohibit the importation, introduction or bringing into specified parts of New South Wales of any plant of the family Musaceae originating from Queensland on account of the disease Black Sigatoka.

HER EXCELLENCY PROFESSOR MARIE BASHIR AC,
Governor

I, Professor MARIE BASHIR AC, Governor of the State of New South Wales with the advice of the Executive Council and pursuant to section 4(1) of the Plant Diseases Act 1924, being of the opinion that any plant of the family Musaceae originating from Queensland is likely to introduce the disease Black Sigatoka (*Mycosphaerella fijiensis* Morelet var. *difformis* Mulder & Stover) into New South Wales, prohibit the importation, introduction or bringing into:

1. The parts of New South Wales specified in Schedule 1 of:
 - (a) any plant of the family Musaceae, or
 - (b) any agricultural equipment which has been used in the cultivation, harvesting or processing of any plant of the family Musaceae, or
 - (c) any covering of goods in, or with which, any plant of the family Musaceae has been contained, or packed, or with which any plant of the family Musaceae has come into contact;
 that originate from the part of Queensland specified in Schedule 2;
2. The part of New South Wales other than the parts specified in Schedule 1 of:
 - (a) any plant of the family Musaceae, or
 - (b) any agricultural equipment which has been used in the cultivation, harvesting or processing of any plant of the family Musaceae, or
 - (c) any covering of goods in, or with which, any plant of the family Musaceae has been contained, or packed, or with which any plant of the family Musaceae has come into contact;

that originate from the part of Queensland specified in Schedule 2 unless in a manner and subject to such conditions as may be approved by the Chief, Division of Plant Industries; and

3. The whole of New South Wales of any banana that originates from the part of Queensland other than the part specified in Schedule 2 unless the packaging is adequately labelled to identify the locality of production.

Definitions

“**banana**” means fruit of any plant of the family Musaceae.

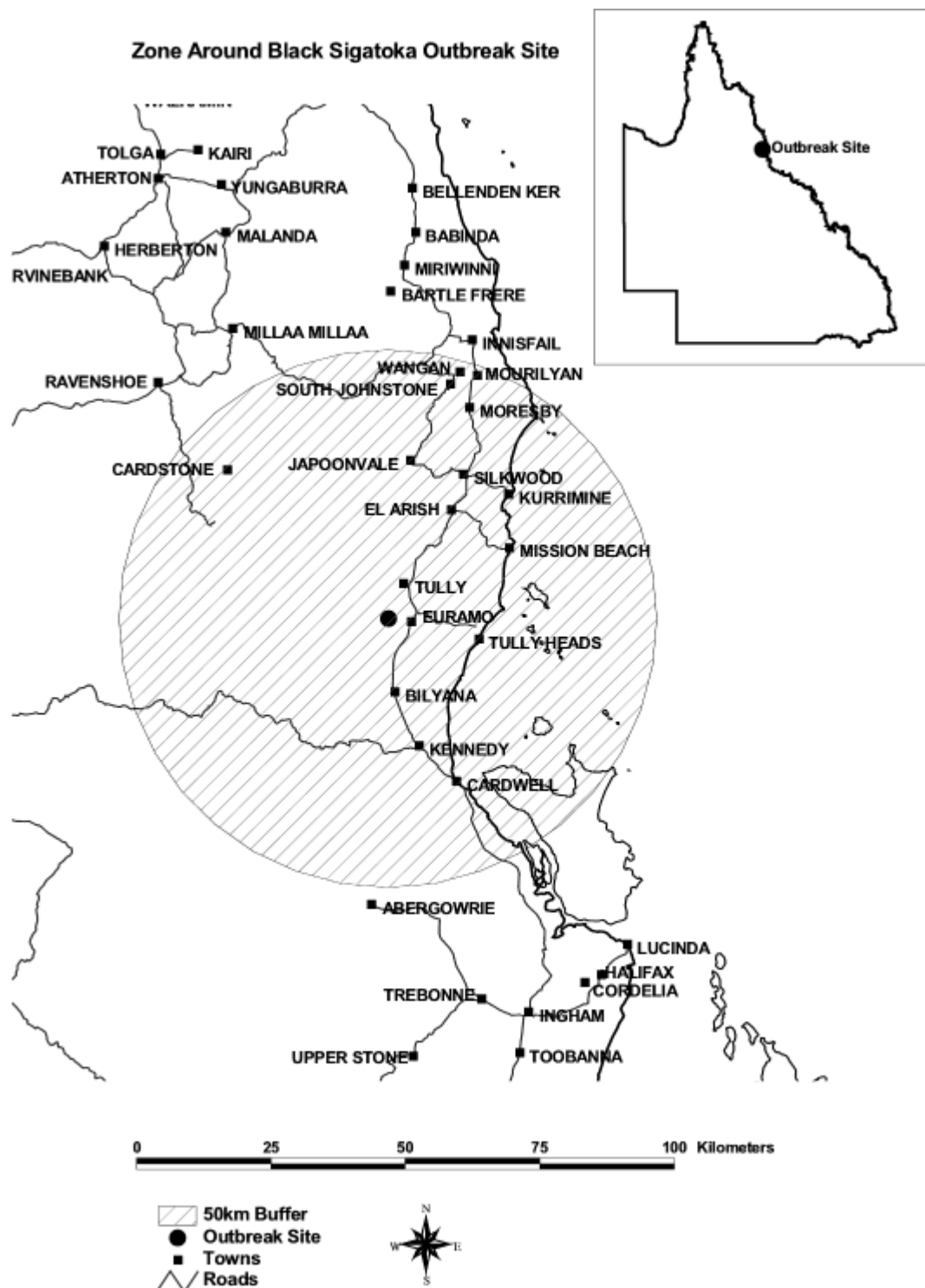

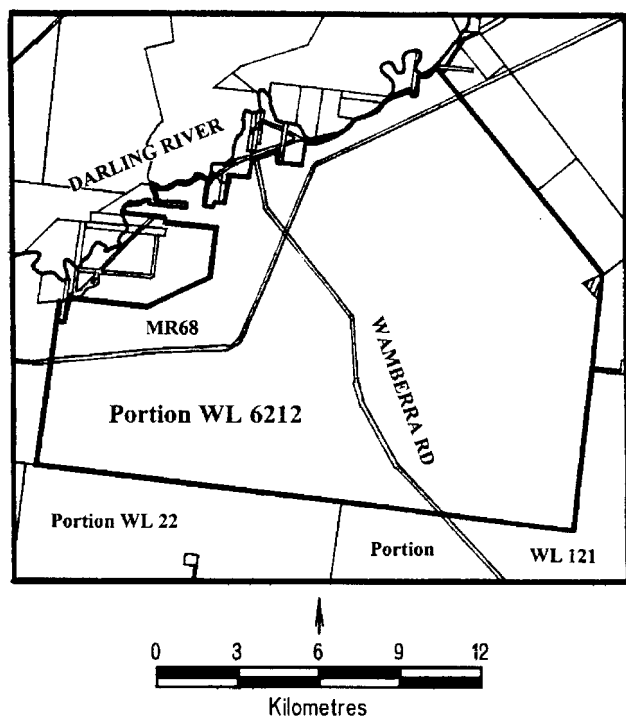

1. Citation

This plan may be cited as Parramatta Local Environmental Plan 1996 (Heritage and Conservation) - Amendment No. 2.

2. Aims, objectives etc.

The aim of this plan is to amend Parramatta Local Environmental Plan 1996 (Heritage and Conservation) by:

- (a) incorporating additional heritage items and heritage conservation areas into that plan, and
- (b) omitting from that plan provisions relating to potential heritage items and potential heritage conservation areas (with some of those items and areas being incorporated into that plan by this plan as heritage items and heritage conservation areas), and
- (c) omitting from that plan certain heritage items and a heritage conservation area, and
- (d) revising the controls for the heritage and conservation of the City of Parramatta.

3. Land to which plan applies

This plan applies to all land within the local government area of the City of Parramatta.

4. Relationship to other environmental planning instruments

This plan amends Parramatta Local Environmental Plan 1996 (Heritage and Conservation) in the manner set out in clause 5.

5. Amendment of Parramatta Local Environmental Plan 1996 (Heritage and Conservation)

Parramatta Local Environmental Plan 1996 (Heritage and Conservation) is amended:

- (a) by omitting clause 2 and by inserting in its place the following clause:

2 Objectives

The objectives of this plan in relation to heritage are:

- (a) to conserve the environmental heritage of the City of Parramatta, and
- (b) to retain the cultural significance of the City of Parramatta, and
- (c) to conserve existing significant fabric, settings, relics and views associated with the heritage significance of heritage items and heritage conservation areas, and
- (d) to ensure that any development does not adversely affect the heritage significance of heritage items and heritage conservation areas and their settings, and
- (e) to ensure that known or potential archaeological sites and places of Aboriginal significance are conserved, and
- (f) to ensure that the heritage conservation areas throughout the City of Parramatta retain their heritage significance.

- (b) by omitting clause 9 and by inserting in its place the following clause:

9 What definitions apply?

- (1) A term defined in the Dictionary has the same meaning when used in this plan.
- (2) In this plan:
 - (a) a reference to a use of land includes a reference to a use of land of the same kind that is proposed, and
 - (b) a reference to a map is a reference to a map kept in the office of the Council.

- (c) by omitting clauses 11, 11A, 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16 and by inserting in their place the following clauses:

11 Protection of heritage items, heritage conservation areas and relics

When is consent required?

- (1) The following development may be carried out only with development consent:
- (a) demolishing or moving a heritage item or a building, work, relic, tree or place within a heritage conservation area,
 - (b) altering a heritage item or a building, work, relic or place within a heritage conservation area by making structural or non-structural changes to its exterior, including changes to its external detail, fabric, finish or appearance,
 - (c) altering a heritage item by making structural changes to its interior,
 - (d) moving a relic, or excavating land and discovering, exposing or moving a relic,
 - (e) demolishing, dismantling, moving or altering a heritage item,
 - (f) erecting a building on, or subdividing, land on which a heritage item is located or which is within a heritage conservation area.

What exceptions are there?

- (2) Development consent is not required if:
- (a) the consent authority is of the opinion that the proposed development is of a minor nature or consists of maintenance of a heritage item or a building, work, relic, tree or place within a heritage conservation area, and
 - (b) the consent authority is of the opinion that the proposed development would not adversely affect the heritage significance of the heritage item or heritage conservation area concerned, and
 - (c) the proponent has notified the consent authority in writing of the proposed development and the consent authority has advised the proponent in writing before the development is carried out that it is satisfied that development consent is not required because of the exception allowed by this provision.

- (3) Development consent is not required by this clause for the creation of a new grave or monument in a graveyard that is a heritage item if the development does not involve demolishing, excavating, defacing or damaging an existing grave, monument or Aboriginal place.

What must be included in assessing a development application?

- (4) When determining a development application required by this clause, the consent authority must assess the extent to which the carrying out of the proposed development would affect the heritage significance of the heritage item or heritage conservation area concerned.
- (5) The assessment is to include (but is not limited to) consideration of:
- (a) for development that would affect a heritage item:
 - (i) the heritage significance of the item as part of the environmental heritage of the City of Parramatta, and
 - (ii) the impact that the proposed development will have on the heritage significance of the item and its setting, including any landscape or horticultural features, and
 - (iii) the measures proposed to conserve the heritage significance of the item and its setting, and
 - (iv) whether any archaeological site or potential archaeological site would be adversely affected, and
 - (v) the extent, if any, to which the carrying out of the proposed development would affect the form of an historic subdivision, and
 - (vi) any submission received in relation to the proposed development in response to the notification or advertising of the application, and
 - (b) for development that would be carried out in a heritage conservation area:
 - (i) the heritage significance of the heritage conservation area and the contribution which any building, work, relic, tree or place affected by the proposed development makes to this heritage significance, and
 - (ii) the impact that the proposed development would have on the heritage significance of the heritage conservation area, and

- (iii) the compatibility of any proposed building or work with nearby original buildings and the character of the heritage conservation area, including compatibility with the existing size, form, scale, orientation, setbacks, materials and detailing, and
- (iv) the measures proposed to conserve the significance of the heritage conservation area and its setting, and
- (v) whether any landscape or horticultural features of heritage significance would be affected, and
- (vi) whether any archaeological site or potential archaeological site would be affected, and
- (vii) the extent, if any, to which the carrying out of the proposed development would affect an historic subdivision pattern, and
- (viii) any submission received in relation to the proposed development in response to the notification or advertising of the application.

What extra documentation is needed?

- (6) When determining whether or not to grant a development consent required by this clause, the consent authority:
 - (a) must not grant such a consent until it has considered a heritage impact statement which includes an assessment of the matters raised in subclause 5 (a) (i) – (v) or 5 (b) (i) – (vii), as the case may require, and
 - (b) where it requires that a conservation management plan should also be considered, may refuse to grant the consent unless a conservation management plan has been considered.

12 Advertised development

The following development is identified as advertised development:

- (a) the demolition of a heritage item or a building, work, relic, tree or place in a heritage conservation area,
- (b) the carrying out of any development allowed by clause 17.

13 Notification of demolition to the Heritage Council

Before granting consent for the demolition of a heritage item identified by this plan as being of State significance, the consent authority must notify the Heritage Council about the application and take into consideration any comments received in response within 28 days after the notice is sent.

14 Development adversely affecting a heritage item or heritage conservation area

- (1) Before granting consent for development that may undermine or otherwise damage a heritage item or a building, work, relic, tree or place within a heritage conservation area or will obscure, overshadow or otherwise have a substantial adverse effect on a view of a heritage item or of a building, work or tree within a heritage conservation area, or that will otherwise adversely affect the heritage significance of a heritage item or heritage conservation area (or that will have a substantial adverse effect on a view from any such item or from habitable places within any such area), the consent authority must assess the impact of the development:
 - (a) on the heritage significance, curtilage and setting of the heritage item or the heritage significance of the heritage conservation area, and
 - (b) on any significant views to or from the heritage item or the heritage conservation area.
- (2) The consent authority may refuse to grant any such consent unless it has considered a heritage impact statement that will help it to assess the impact of the proposed development on the heritage significance, visual curtilage and setting of the heritage item or the heritage significance of the heritage conservation area.
- (3) The heritage impact statement should include details of the size, shape and scale of, setbacks for, and the materials to be used in, any proposed buildings or works and details of any modification that would reduce the impact of the proposed development on the significance of the heritage item or the heritage conservation area.

15 Development of Aboriginal places or of known or potential archaeological sites of Aboriginal cultural heritage significance

- (1) Before granting consent for development that is likely to have an impact on an Aboriginal place, or that will be carried out on an archaeological site that has Aboriginal cultural heritage significance or a potential archaeological site that is reasonably likely to have Aboriginal cultural heritage significance, the consent authority must:
 - (a) consider a heritage impact statement explaining how the proposed development would affect the conservation of the site and any relic known or reasonably likely to be located at the site, and
 - (b) notify the local Aboriginal communities (in such a way as it thinks appropriate) and the Director-General of National Parks and Wildlife of its intention to do so and take into consideration any comments received in response within 28 days after the relevant notice is sent.

16 Development of other known or potential archaeological sites

- (1) Before granting consent for development that will be carried out on any other archaeological site or potential archaeological site, the consent authority must:
 - (a) consider a heritage impact statement explaining how the proposed development would affect the conservation of the site and any relic known or reasonably likely to be located at the site, and
 - (b) notify the Heritage Council of its intention to do so and taken into consideration any comments received in response within 28 days after the notice is sent.
- (2) Subclause (1) does not apply if the proposed development will not involve disturbance of below ground relics and the consent authority is of the opinion that the heritage significance of any above ground relics would not be adversely affected by the proposed development.

17 Conservation incentives

- (1) The consent authority may grant consent to the use for any purpose of a building that is a heritage item, or of the land on which a heritage item is erected, even though the use would otherwise not be allowed by an environmental planning instrument, if:
 - (a) it is satisfied that the retention of the building or item depends on the granting of consent, and
 - (b) the proposed use is in accordance with a conservation management plan which has been approved by the consent authority, and
 - (c) the granting of consent to the proposed use would ensure that all necessary conservation work identified in the conservation management plan is carried out, and
 - (d) the proposed use would not adversely affect the heritage significance of the heritage item or its setting, and
 - (e) the proposed use would not adversely affect the amenity of the surrounding area otherwise than to an insignificant extent.

LOCAL COURTS ACT 1982

Terms and Conditions of Appointment Part-time Magistrates

I, ROBERT JOHN DEBUS, Attorney General, do hereby determine, in accordance with section 22 of the Local Courts Act 1982 that a part time Magistrate, as defined in this determination, shall be subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. Definition of Part time Magistrate

A part-time Magistrate is:

- a Magistrate appointed permanently as a part-time Magistrate, as indicated in their commission; or
- a Magistrate with a full time commission who has entered into an agreement with the Chief Magistrate that they will work part-time.

2. General Conditions

All appointments of permanent part-time Magistrates must be specified as such in the commission of appointment. Part-time Magistrates are entitled to the same status, managerial commitment and support as full

time Magistrates. Permanent part-time Magistrates shall work on days or periods as agreed in writing from time to time with the Chief Magistrate, but not less than 8 days in a four week period and not exceeding 16 days in a four week period. The days or periods worked can be varied in writing with the consent of the Chief Magistrate and the Magistrate concerned.

All arrangements for Magistrates with a full time commission to work part time on a temporary basis must be approved by the Chief Magistrate. The days or periods on which the Magistrate shall work and a period, not exceeding 12 months, for which the Magistrate shall work part-time, shall be as agreed in writing between the Magistrate and the Chief Magistrate. The days or periods worked can be varied with the consent of the Chief Magistrate and the Magistrate concerned. Such variations must be in writing. Temporary part time Magistrates must return to full time work at the expiration of the period agreed to in the agreement with the Chief Magistrate.

3. Salary

The salary of a part-time Magistrate shall be calculated on the salary, as determined from time to time by the Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Tribunal, for the corresponding full-time position and will be paid on a *pro-rata* basis in accordance with the days agreed to be worked.

Payment for days worked outside the agreed days will also be paid on a *pro-rata basis* provided that the written approval of the Chief Magistrate to work those days has been obtained.
