Charter

The Board of Veterinary Surgeons of New South Wales is constituted under Section 4 of the Veterinary Surgeons Act 1986 and is responsible for the keeping of the Roll of Veterinary Surgeons registered to practise in New South Wales and for the licensing of veterinary hospitals The Board also has responsibility for the regulation of the conduct of veterinary surgeons and compliance with the standards of practice of veterinary science.

Aims

The Board aims to act in the interests of the welfare of animals and the public interest in ensuring that the practice of veterinary science in NSW is performed only by registered veterinary surgeons in suitable licenced premises. The Board aims to consult with other State Veterinary Boards and the Australasian Veterinary Boards Council Inc. (AVBC) and organisations representing the interests of members of the veterinary profession and users of veterinary services with a view to achieving the purposes of the Veterinary Surgeons Act 1986.

Access to the Board

The office of the Board has been located at 55 Portman Street, Green Square NSW 2017 since 18 March 2002.

Management and Structure

The Board is appointed by the Governor and Section 5 of the Veterinary Surgeons Act 1986 provides that the Board shall consist of six members.

Term of Office

The Board that was appointed between 1 July 2001 and 31 March 2002 held its final meeting on 4 March 2002. During the period between 31 March and 10 April 2002 there were no members of the Veterinary Surgeons Board. The appointment of all current members of the Board commenced on 10 April 2002 and will expire on 31 December 2002.

The duties of the administrative staff are:

Registrar

Oversee operations; act as Secretary to the Veterinary Surgeons Investigating Committee; provide support to the Board and the Investigating Committee; provide advice to the Board, Veterinary Surgeons and the public; implement Board and Investigating Committee decisions.

Hospital Inspector

Monitor compliance with standards for hospital licensing; provide advice to veterinary surgeons.

Office Administrator

Supervise administrative staff; prepare Board agenda and minutes; support Board members and implement decisions; prepare Board publications; process applications for registration and hospital licences; liaise with the profession and the public.

Finance Officer

Maintain financial records; prepare financial reports; respond to Board and Investigating Committee as required.

Administrative Assistant

Assist in processing of registrations; liaise with the profession and the public; provide administrative support as required by other staff.

VSIC Officer

Provide administrative support to Investigating Committee members; prepare Investigating Committee agenda and minutes; assist in implementing Investigating Committee decisions; provide administrative support as required by the Secretary and other staff.


Human Resources

Summary Review of Operations

The Roll of Veterinary Surgeons

At 30 June 2002 there were 2527 registered veterinary surgeons in New South Wales. There are constant changes in the number registered. Factors causing change are the registration of new graduates and veterinary surgeons from other states and overseas, requests for voluntary removal from the Roll and the death of registered veterinary surgeons together with the restoration to the Roll of veterinary surgeons previously registered.

The total number of registered veterinarians at 30 June 2002 includes 106 Honorary Registrations.

The Roll of Veterinary Specialists

The Advisory Committee on Registration of Veterinary Specialists (ACRVS) assesses applications by Veterinary Surgeons for registration as a specialist in a specific category and recommends registration if the criteria are met.

The ACRVS was established by the Australasian Veterinary Boards Council in 1985 to offer guidance as to which applicants are qualified to be registered as specialists in order to achieve a consistent national standard. It is the responsibility of the State Board to make the final decision in relation to each applicant after recommendation by the ACRVS. The Board registered 9 new Veterinary Specialists in the financial year 2001-2002.

The Register of Veterinary Hospitals

During the financial year 2001-2002 the Board approved licences for 23 new veterinary hospitals in New South Wales and 1 of these hospitals did not open and 1 is still yet to open. 14 veterinary hospitals were upgraded during the financial year 2001-2002. There were 606 Veterinary Hospitals licensed at 30 June 2002.

Some of the Main Issues dealt with by the Board during the Financial Year were:

Hospital Inspector

The appointment of the Hospital Inspector in October 2001 has enabled the Board to systematically collect information as to the level of compliance with the minimum standards for premises where acts of veterinary science are performed. The Board, through the Hospital Inspector, is able to meet the expectation that all such premises will be equipped and maintained according to the minimum standards.

Australasian Veterinary Boards Council Inc. (AVBC)

The Boards in each state and New Zealand constitute the members of the AVBC and provide funding for its activities. The AVBC monitors common issues and educational standards and co-ordinates the National Veterinary Examination (NVE) by arrangement with the National Office of Overseas Skills Recognition. The NVE is a pre-requisite for registration in Australia and New Zealand of graduates of overseas institutions whose qualifications are not recognised in local legislation. The AVBC is currently considering issues relating to the continuing education of veterinary surgeons.

Website

The Board's website is comprehensive and includes Board details and information on legislation and the complaint handling process. There are links to relevant sites including the austlii site and the Australian Veterinary Association and other State and New Zealand Board sites. All of the relevant forms needed for registration and hospital licensing can also be downloaded from the site. The Board intends to make a limited range of details from the Roll of Veterinary Surgeons and the Hospital Licence Register available through a search facility on the website in 2002.

Boardtalk

The Board published the newsletter Boardtalk in August, December 2001 and March 2002. Boardtalk is sent to every veterinarian and it is also available on the website. Through Boardtalk the veterinary profession is informed about current issues and developments affecting the

work of the Board or of interest to the profession.

Fees

Fees were fixed by regulation in September 2001. The Board does not anticipate any need to change the current fees during the next financial year. The Board established a cash reserve in the financial year 2001-2 and is working towards building that reserve to cover contingencies including projected legal costs associated with teh Veterinary Surgeons Investigating Committee and Aministrative Decisions Tribunal.

Student Permits

The Board issues permits to University of Sydney students in the fourth and fifth year of their Degree Studies with a view to facilitating their practical clinical training prior to graduation. 195 permits were issued to University of Sydney students in March 2002. 1 permit was issued to a University of Queensland student in March 2002 and 18 permits were issued to University of Melbourne students in June 2002.

Premises

From 1 July 2000 to 18 March 2002 the Board occupied premises at the Gatehouse Building Alison Road Randwick under a licence agreement with the Australian Jockey Club. The premises were rendered unsuitable because of structural defects and in March 2002 the Board leased its current premises.

Continuing Veterinary Education

The Board in consultation with the AVBC and the profession is considering the issues relating to the implementation of a continuing education programme which will meet the needs of practitioners and the expectations of users of veterinary services in the future.

Payment of Accounts

The Board pays all its accounts promptly and within the indicators set by the Treasurer. It is standard operating procedure to pay accounts as soon as is practicable and in any event within 30 days.

Factors Affecting the Board during the Financial Year

Legal Change

The Veterinary Surgeons Act 1986

The President, some Board members and the Registrar have met with the Minister and Departmental staff to discuss proposed changes to the Act.

Economic Factors

The Board has achieved a cash surplus during this financial year and is in a financially sound position.

Does the Veterinary Surgeons Act 1986 bind the Crown?

The Act does not expressly bind the Crown and there are differing views as to whether Veterinary Surgeons in Government employment are required to be registered. The Board requires registration by all persons wishing to practise veterinary science in NSW.

Equal Employment Opportunity

The Board complies with Equal Employment Opportunity principles in its policies and procedures relating to employment.

Disability Plans

The Board does not have a formal disability plan. Special arrangements are made from time to time (as required) to meet the needs of those with disabilities. Staff have undertaken training in relation to the needs of people with disabilities and disability awareness.

Consultants

The Board did not engage any consultants at a cost in excess of \$30,000 per annum during the financial year 2001-2002.

Land Disposal

The Board has never owned any real estate.

Research and Development

The Board has established measures to collect information about the employment patterns of registered Veterinary Surgeons. Veterinary Surgeons are asked to specify which of eight categories best describes their present occupation - private practice; government officer; government research; university teaching; other veterinary pursuit; pharmaceutical industry; non-veterinary pursuit; or research and development. This research will result in statistics being prepared for publication in Boardtalk and on the website.

Promotion

The Board issues the following publications:

- Annual Report
- Annual Veterinary Surgeons Roll (listing all currently registered veterinary surgeons and specialists and all licenced hospitals).
- A newsletter Boardtalk
- Website
- Veterinary Surgeons Act 1986 and Regulations

These are available on request through the Registrar. The newsletter and Veterinary Surgeons Act are available on the Board's website and a search facility for the Roll will be available on the website in 2002.

Overseas Visits

No overseas visits were taken by officers or employees of the Board.

Consumer Response

The Veterinary Surgeons Investigating Committee deals with formal complaints of professional misconduct by veterinary surgeons. Other complaints to the Board by consumers and veterinary surgeons and the public are dealt with by the staff of the Board. As far as is practicable the staff provide an immediate response to complaints by telephone or fax. The staff have a broad knowledge of the kinds of advice usually required including practical and legal advice and referral to more appropriate agencies. Complaints received in writing are considered at a Board meeting and the Registrar makes a response as directed by the Board.

Risk Management and Insurance Activities

The Board maintains insurance cover for its assets and any liability of staff and Board members. It also maintains Workers Compensation insurance as required by the Workers Compensation legislation.

Controlled Entities

The Veterinary Surgeons Investigating Committee is the only other entity associated with and financed by the Board. A detailed statement on the operations and activities of the Committee is included in this report.

Ethnic Affairs Priorities

The Board does not have a formal ethnic affairs statement. The staff of the Board are aware of the special needs of consumers who are from a non-English speaking or different cultural background. Appropriate assistance such as access to intrepreter services is made available as required.

NSW Government Action Plan for Women

The Board is committed to ensuring that the Government's philosophy in relation to women and womens' issues is implemented in all aspects of the functions of the Board. At all times during the financial year the majority of staff of the Board were women. Many registered veterinary surgeons are women and more than 50% of new

graduates are women. The staff of the Board have frequent contact with consumers and are well trained in meeting the needs of all clients of the Board including women.

Occupational Health and Safety

The Board is aware of its occupational health and safety obligations and informs staff by way of a noticeboard of relevant changes. No work related illnesses or injuries were reported during the year and the Board was not prosecuted in respect of any occupational health and safety related illnesses.

Delivery of Electronic Services

The Board is able to provide many services by electronic means including the provision of forms and documents by e-mail and the website. The Board uses e-mail extensively for communication with and the provision of information to the profession and the public. Board and Committee members exchange information electronically and on a frequent basis. The Board and its staff recognise the savings in time and costs which are achieved by the use of electronic services.

VETERINARY SURGEONS INVESTIGATING COMMITTEE

Constitution and Function

The Veterinary Surgeons Investigating Committee is constituted under Section 24 of the Veterinary Surgeons Act, 1986. The five members are appointed by the Minister for Agriculture. The Committee investigates complaints of professional misconduct by registered Veterinary Surgeons.

The Investigating Committee appointed by the Minister for the period of July 2001 - 31 March 2002 held its final meeting on 26 March 2002. During the period between 31 March and 10 April 2002 there were no members of the Investigating Committee. The new Committee members appointed on 10 April 2002 held their first meeting on 7 May 2002. The appointment of all current Committee members expires on 31 December 2002. The Committee meets once a month and more fequently as required.



Review of Operations

During 2001/2002 the Investigating Committee investigated 37 new complaints and continued the investigation of 79 complaints current at 1 July 2001. 95 complaints were finalised and at 30 June 2002 there were 21 complaints current and 3 complaints were awaiting determination in the Administrative Decisions Tribunal. The Committee is precluded by Section 27(3) and 29(3) of the Veterinary Surgeons Act 1986 from publishing details of any complaints.





INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT

Scope

I have audited the accounts of the Board of Veterinary Surgeons of New South Wales for the year ended 30 June 2002. 1. General

The Veterinary Surgeons Act, 1986 requires that persons practising veterinary science in the State be registered with the Board. The expenses of the Board are met directly from the revenue collected by the Board mainly in the form of licence and application fees

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Accounting

The Board's financial statements are a general purpose financial report and have been prepared in accordance with:

- o applicable Australian Accounting Standards;
- o other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB);
- o Urgent Issues Group (UIG) Consensus Views; and
- o the requirements of the Public Finance and Audit Act 1983 and Regulation.

The Statement of Financial Performance and the Statement of Financial Position are prepared on an accrual basis. The Financial Report is prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention. All amounts are rounded to the nearest one thousand dollars and are expressed in Australian currency.

(b) Non-Current Assets (Plant and Equipment)

Plant and equipment costing \$500 and above individually are capitalised.

Depreciation is provided for on a straight line basis so as to write off the depreciable amount of each asset as it is consumed over its useful life to the Board.

Asset class useful lines are:

Office furniture and equipment – 5 years

Motor Vehicle - 3 years

Computer Equipment - 5 years

c) Cash

For the purposes of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash includes cash at bank and cash on hand.

d) Revenue Recognition

Income in the main is derived from Veterinary Surgeons annual Roll Fees (due on 31 October) and annual Hospital Licence fees (due on 30 June). Payment of Roll Fees depends upon the exercise of an election to renew registration and are recognised at the date of payment. Fees were increased from 1 October 2001and that increase is reflected in increased income over the previous year. 50% of the Veterinary Surgeons Roll Fees is included as Unearned Revenue and recognised as a Liability because the fees are paid in respect of the calendar year 1 January to 31 December.

9. Financial Instruments

Financial Instruments include cash, receivables and payables and are shown in the financial records at cost. All financial instruments including revenues, expenses or other cash flows arising from instruments are recognised on an accruals basis.

Cash

Cash comprises Cash at Bank and Cash on Hand. The value of the cash as at 30 June 2002 was \$579,175 (30 June 2001 - \$186,762). The cash at bank earned interest at the weighted effective interest rate of 4.9%.

Receivables

All debtors are recognised as amounts receivable as at 30 June 2002. No provision has been made for doubtful debts as no doubtful debts have been identified. No interest is charged on debts. Penalties and late fees are applied after the due date for payment of fees as provided in the Regulations. The value of receivables as at 30 June 2002 was \$129,239 (30 June 2001 - \$45,763). The increase results substantially from the application of the correct due date for Hospital Licence Fees as 30 June 2002 rather than I July as in the previous year.

Payables

The liabilities are recognised for amounts due to be paid in the future for goods and services rendered whether or not invoiced. Amounts owing to suppliers (which are unsecured) are settled in accordance with the policy set out in Treasurer's Direction 219.01. If trade terms are not specified, payment is made no later than the end of the month following the month in which an invoice or a statement is received. Treasurer's Direction 219.01 allows the Minister to award interest for late payment. The value of payables as at 30 June 2002 was \$46,377 (30 June 2001 - \$29,014).
