

# I Introduction and Methodology

## 1.1 Name of the Proposed Activity

Rehabilitation of Bridge on Parramatta Road over Duck River, Auburn

## 1.2 Local Government Areas

Parramatta City Council and Auburn Council

## 1.3 RTA Region

Sydney Region

#### 1.4 Introduction

The Roads and Traffic Authority of NSW (RTA) proposes to carry out rehabilitation of the Bridge on Parramatta Road over the Duck River (the River) which is located on the border of Auburn and Granville (the Bridge).

This Proforma I Review of Environmental Factors (REF) has been prepared by Environmental Technology on behalf of RTA Sydney Asset Management. For the purposes of these works, the RTA is the proponent and the determining authority under Part 5 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment (EP&A) Act 1979.

The purpose of the REF is to describe the Proposal, to document the likely impacts of the Proposal on the environment, and to detail protective measures to be implemented.

The description of the proposed works and associated environmental impacts have been undertaken in context of Clause 228 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2000*, the *Threatened Species Conservation (TSC) Act 1995*, the *Fisheries Management (FM) Act 1994*, and the (Commonwealth) *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) Act 1999*. In doing so, the REF helps to fulfil the requirements of Section 111 of the EP&A Act, that the RTA examine and take into account to the fullest extent possible, all matters affecting or likely to affect the environment by reason of the activity.

This REF has been prepared in accordance with the RTA's Proforma I REF as presented in the RTA's *Environmental Impact Assessment Policy, Guidelines and Procedures, Version 4 2001.* 

The findings of the REF would be considered when assessing:

 Whether the Proposal is likely to have a significant impact on the environment and therefore the necessity for an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) under Section 112 of the EP&A Act.

- The significance of any impact on threatened species as defined by the TSC Act, in Section 5A of the EP&A Act and therefore the requirement for a Species Impact Statement (SIS).
- The potential for the Proposal to significantly impact a matter of national environmental significance or Commonwealth land and the need to make a referral to the Commonwealth Environment Minister in accordance with the EPBC Act.

## 1.5 Background

The original Bridge over the River was built in 1914 and consisted of 8 continuous spans with dimensions of  $I \times 3.05 m$ ,  $6 \times 3.66 m$  and  $I \times 3.05 m$ . In 1930, the Bridge was widened on the northern side by building four additional spans with each span having a dimension varying from 7.0m to 7.6m. The Bridge was widened again in 1966 on both sides to carry public utilities and footways. This latest widening consisted of another 4 spans with each span having a dimension varying from 7.0m to 7.6m. All of the above spans are supported on piles and by the abutments. Most of these elements are exposed but some are covered by the abutments.

In February 2005 a detailed inspection and assessment report was prepared by RTA Operations, Bridge Section Bridge Evaluation and Assessment (RTA, 2005). This report found that the Bridge is generally in good condition except for the piles and that the Bridge still has a substantial life span once the piles are repaired. The report recommended that regular maintenance and inspection of the bridge be carried out and that rehabilitation works be performed within the next 6 to 12 months. The rehabilitation works recommended are:

- repair all piles classified in RTA (2005) as in Fair, Poor or Very Poor condition;
- provide protective coating to all piles;
- repair all the minor spalls in the headstocks and soffits; and
- maintain/replace the rusty attachments for the services under the bridge.

A subsequent report was prepared in September 2005 by GHD Pty Ltd (GHD). This report investigated the scope of the repairs required. The GHD report concluded that:

- approximately 40m<sup>2</sup> of pile surface area is damaged representing approximately 20% of the total exposed pile surface area;
- the amount of pile surface damage has increased by an estimated 20% since an investigation performed in 2000 by Taywood Engineering Ltd (not examined for this REF);
- the dominant corrosion mechanism for the pile element is chloride ingress; and
- the dominant deterioration mechanism for the superstructure elements is carbonation, however no corrosion damage was found on these elements.

The Proposal would involve the implementation of works to rehabilitate the Bridge piles and to prevent further corrosion by chlorine ingress.

## 1.6 Methodology

The method in which this document has been prepared is as follows:

- 1. A discussion was held with the Project Manager to consider the Proposal.
- 2. An RTA Environmental Technology representative undertook a site visit on the 28th November, 2005 to provide an overview of the Proposal and to discuss any issues relevant to the completion of the REF.
- 3. The following agencies and RTA personnel were notified and/or consulted:
  - RTA's Aboriginal Heritage Advisor, Sydney Region;
  - Parramatta City Council;
  - Auburn Council; and
  - DPI Fisheries.
- 4. A desktop search was conducted on the following databases to identify any potential issues:
  - Australian Heritage Database;
  - NSW Heritage Office State Heritage Register and State Heritage Inventory;
  - DEC Aboriginal Heritage Information Management System (AHIMS);
  - DEC Atlas of NSW Wildlife Threatened Flora and Fauna Records;
  - DEH Protected Matters (EPBC Act) Database;
  - DPI FishFiles Database and NSW Fisheries Threatened Species List;
  - DEC Contaminated Land Records;
  - DEC Air Quality Records;
  - DNR Acid Sulphate Soils Risk Map;
  - National Pollutant Inventory; and
  - DPI Noxious Weeds List.
- 6. A literature review and review of documentation was undertaken with regards to the following:
  - Landform, Geology, and Soils;
  - Potential Acid Sulphate Soils;
  - Local Environment Plans;
  - Regional Environmental Plans;
  - State Environmental Planning Policies;
  - Council's State of Environment Report;

# 2 Description of Proposal Site and Study Area

#### 2.1 Location




Figure 2.1: Location of the Proposal (Map provided courtesy of Sydways digital maps. Not to Scale)

The Bridge is located on Parramatta Road on the border of Auburn and Granville (Figure 2.1). The area that would be directly impacted by the proposed works is known as the Proposal site. The Proposal site is the area under the Bridge and the south-east bank of the River immediately adjacent to the Bridge and adjacent to Parramatta Road. A buffer zone of 50m is applied in all directions around the Proposal site and 100m upstream (south) and downstream (north) of the Proposal site. The buffer zone is conservatively applied and accounts for potential indirect impacts. The study area for the Proposal incorporates the Proposal site and the buffer zone.

## 2.2 Description of the Existing Environment

#### 2.2.1 General

The study area is located within an extensively disturbed setting and is characterised by urbanisation. The Duck River riparian zone is narrow and weed infested (Appendix A, Photo I). Remnant vegetation includes Grey Mangroves (Avicenna marina.), Swamp Oak (Casuarina glauca) and Gum trees (Eucalyptus sp.). Many of the trees are covered in exotic vines and rubbish litters the banks and is caught among the Bridge piles. The remains of old wooden piles are observed under the Bridge at low tide and are in an advanced state of decay.

Land use in the study area is characterised by retail, industry and transport. The Bridge experiences a high volume of commuter and heavy traffic and is flanked on all four sides by accesses to industrial and commercial premises. The entrance to the Clyde Waste Transfer Station (transfer of waste from road to rail) is located south-east of the Bridge. This operation generates numerous heavy vehicle trips through the Proposal site, primarily of rubbish trucks.

The Bridge facilitates east-west traffic flow between Parramatta and Sydney. It comprises a reinforced concrete deck, supported by seven rows of headstock and crossbeam that in turn are supported by 49 reinforced concrete square piles. The Bridge carries three lanes eastbound (of which one is a right hand turning lane) and two lanes westbound. The speed limit along this stretch of Parramatta Road and across the Bridge is 60km/h.

The area is well serviced by public transport. The rail stations, Clyde, Granville and Auburn are all in close proximity. A number of used and disused rail bridges cross the River south of the Proposal site. There is no cycleway through the Proposal site however a pedestrian footpath runs along each length of the Bridge.

#### 2.2.2 Topography

The Proposal site is located within a small gully associated with the River. The surrounding areas to the east and west, including the road and the Bridge, are largely level with a local relief of less than 2m. The River channel directs water flow in a winding route from the northwest to the northeast and the banks along it are moderately to steeply sloping. Within the study area, the riparian zone is wider south of the Bridge, facilitating banks with longer and gentler slopes. North of the Bridge, the banks are steeper and shorter and commercial premises are built close to the water's edge.

## 2.2.3 Geology and Soils

The soil landscape present at the Proposal site is identified as Disturbed Terrain (Chapman et al., 1989). This indicates that the soil materials present have not developed in-situ rather they comprise imported fill and other waste material. There is a potential for existing site contamination, depending on the fill imported.

The study area forms part of the headwaters of Sydney Harbour and is a tributary of the Parramatta River. It is likely that before filling the area was swampy. The geology is described as, artificial fill which may be comprised of rocks, demolition rubble and industrial and household waste. The topsoil is likely comprised of alluvium, gravel, sand, silt and clay (Chapman et al., 1989).

The study area is largely covered by concrete, buildings and roads. Limitations of disturbed terrain are dependent on the nature of the fill material, however common issues include, mass movement hazard, unconsolidated low strength materials, impermeable soil, poor drainage and toxic materials. There is no evidence observed of recent erosion or slumping of the River banks within the study area.

#### 2.2.4 Climate

The closest weather recording station is located at Parramatta, NSW and is approximately 3km northwest of the study area. Data from this recording station, sourced from the Commonwealth Bureau of Meteorology website, indicates that the study area experiences a moderate climate. The driest months of the year are from August to November with an average rainfall of 58mm per month. January to April provides warm and wet conditions with an average rainfall of 94mm per month and up to an average of 10 rain days per month.

#### 2.2.5 Drainage and Watercourses

The study area is located within the Duck River catchment and the Proposal site is approximately 2.7km upstream from the confluence with the Parramatta River. The River is a major tributary of the Parramatta River and has a large catchment of approximately 45km² containing dense residential, commercial and industrial areas. The Proposal site is located approximately 1km upstream of the Lower Duck River Wetlands which are listed as significant remnant wetlands on the Australian Heritage Database.

Within the Proposal site the River is subject to tidal flows. Runoff from Parramatta Road drains directly to the River via two stormwater drains that discharge at the northwest and southwest abutments (Photos 2 and 3, Appendix A). The site visit was performed after rainfall and at low tide. At this time, flow in the River was brown in colour.

North of the Bridge within the Proposal site, the banks of the River are modified by use of rock rubble and retaining walls. Commercial premises and car parks are built on this reclaimed area and are located on the bank of the River. The River channel is of natural material and appears to be silted.

Within the study area, the riparian zone is partially fenced. Access is limited to scrambling down vegetated banks. There is no pathway to the waters edge or alongside the River and it appears that persons do not regularly access the riparian zone. It is considered that recreational use of this section of the River is limited to viewing by pedestrians crossing the bridge. The River is closed to recreational vessels.

## 2.2.6 Biodiversity

The study area is located approximately Ikm northeast of the Duck River Reserve, which incorporates open parklands, playing fields and walking and cycle pathways. The River defines a narrow vegetated corridor along its length, which widens in some places to accommodate reserves, gardens and parkland. Newington Nature Reserve, incorporating Wanngul Wetlands is located approximately 4km northwest of the study area after the confluence of the River with the Parramatta River. Discussion of threatened flora and fauna listed previously recorded or potentially occurring in the study area is provided in Section 8.4.

### Flora

A narrow band of remnant vegetation occurs along the river banks. These include Grey Mangroves (Avicenna marina.), Swamp Oak (Casuarina glauca), Gum trees (Eucalyptus sp.) and Wattle (Acacia sp.). A weedy understorey is present including Green Cestrum (Cestrum parqui), Lantana (Lantana camera) and Castor Oil Plants (Ricinis communis). The groundcover is comprised of weed species including Cobblers Pegs (Bidens pilosa), Balloon Vine (Cardiospermum grandiflorum) and Morning Glory (Ipomea indica)

#### Fauna

The study area provides habitat that may be utilised by a number of bird, bat and mammal species. No hollows or fallen logs were observed, however scrutiny was impaired by the presence of a thick carpet of vine growth over the ground and around the tree trunks. A Welcome Swallow (*Hirundo neoxena*) was observed nesting under the Bridge.

Aquatics

Within the study area the River is approximately 7m wide and up to 1m deep. Grey Mangroves grow along the edge of the river and the toe of the river bank is characterised by mangrove pneumatophores. Pneumatophores are specialised emergent roots that grow vertically and function to deliver oxygen to roots below the water surface. These root systems stabilise the mangrove trees and buffer the bank against erosion. Mangroves in the study area appear healthy and young mangrove plants are observed naturally regenerating bare sections of the bank.

At the time of the site visit there had been recent rain and the River was flowing moderately at low tide and was characterised by open water that was cloudy brown in colour. Snags were observed, however no fish activity was evident. During a subsequent site visit by regional environmental staff the water was clear and activity of fish (determined to be mullet) was observed.

Within the study area the banks are earthen, excepting the north eastern banks which partially consist of retaining timber walls and rock rubble.

#### 2.2.7 Noise

There are no sensitive noise receptors within the vicinity of the Proposal site and the existing noise levels are high. The Proposal site is located under a busy road that experiences high volumes of heavy traffic. Commercial and industrial premises are located adjacent to the Proposal site. The majority of adjacent retail trading activity is performed indoors and use of these premises is during business hours. There are no residences, schools or other sensitive receptors within the vicinity of the Proposal site.

## 2.2.8 Air Quality

Air quality within the Parramatta LGA and the Auburn LGA is influenced by the entire Western Sydney Region and varies from moderate to low. Under given conditions, pollution generated further west impacts upon the area and vice versa. Air pollution continues to be a problem in the Parramatta and Auburn LGAs.

#### 2.2.9 Visual Amenity

The visual amenity of the Bridge from the road is low. The bridge design is such that there are few defining features, apart from the handrail, to alert road users that a waterway is being crossed or that a bridge structure is in place. The surface of the bridge largely resembles a continuation of the road and is not a dominating feature of the area (Appendix A, Photo 4). The presence of mangroves and other riparian vegetation within the study area provides moderate visual amenity to road users and pedestrians.

#### 2.2.10 Traffic

The RTA Annual Average Daily Traffic (AADT) data indicate that Parramatta Road at the Duck River Bridge has an average daily total of 62633 vehicles (2002 count). This data accounts for all vehicles moving through the area in both directions.

A speed camera is located within the eastern portion of the study area. The study area does not contain any bus stop. Traffic is observed during the site visit to be busy with many trucks, semi-trailers and garbage trucks using the Bridge.

## 3 Description of the Proposal

At the time of writing, the contract for design and construction of the Proposal had not yet gone to tender, therefore a detailed construction process specific to the Proposal is not included in this REF. A likely description of the Proposal, based on similar projects, is detailed below. If the final construction processes deviate from this description, the Regional Environmental Advisor, Sydney Region would be informed and would determine whether further assessment is required.

## 3.1 Description of the Proposal

The Proposal is for maintenance works on the Bridge on Parramatta Road over the Duck River at Auburn. The proposed works would include repair to the structural integrity of the Bridge and installation of an impressed current cathodic protection (ICCP) system on the piles to mitigate the effect of alkali aggregate reaction (AAR). All works would be performed at low tide and there would be no need for a coffer dam. The piers would be accessed from the river bank by foot and all equipment would be carried in.

The repair process would involve removal of damaged concrete material on the piles as identified in the pre-installation survey. This would involve cutting and cleaning the damaged area with grinders, saws, jackpicks and high pressure water blasting. Renderoc HB40, Barramortar HL or Renderoc LA55 would be used to backfill the surfaces of the repaired piles as per ICCP system recommendations. Additionally the surface would be tool finished and curing and bonding agents would not be used between any of the layers. Where applicable, the concrete used would be suitable for underwater applications.

Each pile would have a series of recesses cut to fix the ribbon members for the ICCP system. There would be no installation of ICCP system elements to the sandstone abutments of the Bridge. Additional concrete housing would be installed and evenly spaced vertical reinforcements would be implemented. Anode ribbons would be installed vertically on the outer side of the steel reinforcement being separated from the reinforcement by a cementitious spacer. The concrete housing would extend from below the mean low water level to the headstock soffit of the bridge.

The ICCP system would involve installation of a digital remote control and monitoring system on one corner of the bridge. The main characteristics of the system would include:

- Online monitoring;
- Remote control and monitoring facility;
- Constant current control;
- Alarm function;
- Graphical user interface;
- Automatic data collection and saving; and
- Automatic stray current test.

One junction box for each pile would be positioned between the pile column and road deck and zinc silver/silver chloride electrodes would be installed at various locations on the Bridge structure. To monitor the soil water anode system, electrodes would be installed in the water at a number of the piles and in the soil at the base of at least one pile.

PVC conduit covered feeder cables would supply a current from the digital remote control and monitoring unit to each of the junction boxes that would in turn transfer the current to the anode ribbon. An anode sled would be located on the creek bed and a PVC conduit anode cable would direct current to the sled. The conduit and cable would be routed via the piles to the anode sled, which would be weighted with concrete bags.

The concrete housing for the piers would be poured into a custom pre-made mould. All works would be performed at low tide and there would be no need for a coffer dam.

The ICCP System would be implemented in accordance with the following Australian Standards:

- AS 2832.2, Cathodic Protection of Metals, Part 2: Compact buried structures;
- AS 2832.3. Cathodic Protection of Metals. Part 3: Fixed immersed structures;
- AS 2832.5-2002, Cathodic Protection of Metals, Part 5: Steel in concrete structures.

#### 3.2 Construction Activities

## 3.2.1 Construction Processes and Work Methodology

The piers would be accessed from the river bank on foot at low tide and all equipment would be carried in. The piles of the Bridge would be cleaned and repaired prior to application of the ICCP. Implementation of the ICCP would be a staged process actioning each pile individually and sequentially. The anode ribbons would be inserted to pre-cut vertical slots on each pile before adding the concrete to a prepared moulding by pouring using a pump.

Excavation would be undertaken at one pile to enable the protection system to be implemented below the mean low water level. If the spoil is determined to be free from contamination and not potential acid sulphate soil, it would be recycled as fill for the excavated area after application of the anode ribbons and concrete.

Following repair of the piles, a coating system would be applied to the superstructure elements.

#### 3.2.2 Construction Equipment

Plant and equipment likely to be used in the construction would include:

- Air compressor;
- Power tools (electric saws, drills, grinders, vibratory hammers);
- Various hand tools;
- Scaffold;
- Water pump;
- Truck and utility; and
- Concrete trucks and pump.

#### 3.2.3 Access

Access to the Proposal site would be obtained via the south eastern bank of the River via the driveway to the Clyde Marshalling Yards located east of the Proposal site. Access to the area under the Bridge via the River bank would be by traversing on foot below the first span of the westbound lane. The access would be cleared of weed matter that characterises this area and from the top of the bank to away from the waters edge would be gravel covered to reduce the impact of vehicles and equipment and to ameliorate any erosion that may occur. Use of this area would enable efficient transfer of equipment and materials for the proposed activities.

#### 3.2.4 Utilities

Electricity for the site would be sourced from the existing power utility poles located along Parramatta Road. This would provide power required for the construction activities and to operate the ICCP system. The electricity would be trenched from the pole to where the digital remote control and monitoring system is installed and would not involve any vegetation clearing. Generators may also be used as an alternative to provide power for the construction activities.

A water main is located under the Bridge, however it is not anticipated that this utility would be relocated or impacted upon as a result of the Proposal.

The Contractor would obtain the appropriate utility drawings before any work involving utilities. Work involving utilities would be determined prior to commencement of works in consultation with the relevant service provider and would be undertaken or directed by the relevant service provider.

#### 3.2.5 Source of Material

Materials for the ICCP system would be sourced from a supplier of materials required for the cathodic protection process. Concrete and similar material would be obtained from local businesses within the region as required. Materials would be transported to the site as required and not stockpiled, to eliminate the need for an extensive storage area.

## 3.2.6 Additional Truck Movements

The proposed works would result in approximately four additional truck movements per day which would involve the RTA gang truck and utility on a daily basis and a concrete truck as required over the period of construction.

#### 3.2.7 Stockpile and Compound Sites

A small compound site would be located within the industrial area located immediately south east of the Proposal site. The industrial area is easily accessed from either the eastbound or westbound lanes of Parramatta Road via the driveway to the Clyde Marshalling Yards. The compound site would be established on a level sealed section of ground as arranged by consultation with the proprietors of the property. No additional clearing or vegetation removal would be required for the compound site. The compound site would maintain the requirements of the Proposal with equipment being transported to and from the Proposal site on a daily basis. Whilst the location of the compound site is not likely to be subject to flooding, in the event of a likely flood event as determined by weather reports, the compound site would be decommissioned and all equipment and personnel removed.

Stockpiling at the compound site may be required for the small amount of excavated material resulting from installing elements of the ICCP below the mean low water level. Sediment fences and bunding would be implemented to reduce the chance of any material escaping and entering the River.

## 3.3 Workforce and Working Hours

The workforce would comprise approximately 5-6 personnel.

It is anticipated that working hours for the Proposal would be undertaken during standard working hours adopted by the RTA as detailed below:

## Standard Working Hours:

Monday – Friday: 7.00am to 6.00pm Saturday: 8.00am to 1.00pm

Sunday and Public Holidays: No work.

Work within the River bed would only be performed at low tide.

Should work be required outside of the standard working hours, the procedure contained in the RTA's *Environmental Noise Management Manual 2001*, "*Practice Note vii – Roadworks Outside of Normal Working Hours*" would be followed.

#### 3.4 Commencement of Works

It is anticipated that the proposed works would commence in the third week of March 2006.

#### 3.5 Period of Construction

Given ideal working conditions it is anticipated that construction duration would be a period of approximately 14 weeks from the commencement date.

#### 3.6 Proposal Cost and Source of Funds

The Proposal would cost approximately \$450,000 and funding would be sourced from the State Maintenance Fund.

## 4 Statutory Position

#### 4.1 Local Environmental Plans

The Proposal is located within land located at the borders of the Local Government Areas (LGA) of Parramatta City Council and Auburn Council. The boundary between the two LGAs is provided by the path of the River. The following LEPs are relevant to the Proposal:

- Parramatta Local Environment Plan, 2001 (LEP 2001); and
- Auburn Local Environment Plan, 2000 (LEP 2000).

### Parramatta Local Environment Plan, 2001

Where the Proposal site is located within land controlled by the LEP 2001 the land is assigned as Zone 4, Employment Zone. Under this zone, development for roads is allowed with consent. However, Part 1, Clause 11 of the LEP 2001 adopts Clause 35 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Model Provisions, 1980* (Model Provisions). Clause 35 of the Model Provisions states:

'Nothing in the local environment plan shall be construed as restricting or prohibiting or enabling the consent authority to restrict or prohibit:

(a) the carrying out of development of any description specified in Schedule 1'

Schedule I of the Model Provisions describes:

'8 The carrying out of any development required in connection with the construction, reconstruction, improvement, maintenance or repair of any road, except the widening, realignment or relocation of such a road.'

The Proposal would be for the improvement and repair of a road. Therefore where the proposed works would be performed in Zone 4, the Employment Zone of the Parramatta LGA, development consent from Council would not be required due to adoption of the Model Provisions in the LEP 2001.

#### Auburn Local Environment Plan, 2000

Where the Proposal site is located within land controlled by the LEP 2000 the land is assigned as Zone 4(c) Industrial Enterprise Zone. Under this zone, development for utility undertakings is allowed with consent. However, Part 10, Clause 58 *Development by public authorities*, of the LEP 2000 states that:

'(1) Nothing in this plan is to be construed as restricting or prohibiting or enabling the consent authority to restrict or prohibit, the carrying out of an activity of any description specified in Schedule 3 by a public authority or a corporation that was a public authority that has been privatised.'

Schedule 3 Development by public authorities of the LEP 2000 describes:

'8 The carrying out of any development required in connection with the construction, reconstruction, improvement, maintenance, repair or operation of any road, except the widening or realignment of a road.'

The Proposal would be for the improvement and repair of a road. Therefore where the proposed works would be performed in Zone 4(c) the Industrial Enterprise Zone in the Auburn LGA, development consent from Council would not be required, due to adoption of the Model Provisions in the LEP 2000.

## 4.2 Regional Environmental Plans

The following Regional Environmental Plan (REP) applies to the Proposal:

Sydney Regional Environmental Plan (Sydney Harbour Catchment) 2005 (Sydney Harbour Catchment REP)

The Sydney Harbour Catchment REP applies to land within the Sydney Harbour Catchment. The Proposal site falls within land shown edged with heavy black on the Sydney Regional Environmental Plan (Sydney Harbour Catchment) 2005—Foreshores and Waterways Area Map. The aims of the Sydney Harbour Catchment REP, in Part 1, Clause 2 include:

'(a) to ensure that the catchment....waterways.... of Sydney Harbour are recognised, protected, enhanced and maintained:

for existing and future generations,.....

(c) to achieve a high quality and ecologically sustainable urban environment'

The Proposal for rehabilitation of the Bridge contributes to achievement of these objectives. Deterioration of the Bridge would lead to greater traffic congestion in the area. This would worsen air pollution and leakage of fuels and oils from vehicles. Rehabilitation of the Bridge would prevent material from eroding off the structure and polluting downstream areas and would facilitate ongoing efficient use of motor vehicle transport which would lessen the potential for detrimental impacts on the natural environment. Rehabilitation of the Bridge would ensure ongoing use of the associated road by existing and future generations and would improve and maintain a public asset to sustain the quality of the urban environment. Maintaining a high quality urban environment would minimise the impact on the surrounding natural environment, by facilitating efficient travel and by stabilising the Bridge structure. The Proposal would contribute to protection of the quality of the waterway for existing and future generations.

Part 1, Clause 10 of the Sydney Harbour Catchment REP states:

'Nothing in this plan is to be construed as restricting or prohibiting or enabling the consent authority to restrict or prohibit the carrying out of development of any description specified in Schedule I of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Model Provisions 1980 on land within the Foreshores and Waterways Area.'

The Model Provisions are discussed in Section 4.1. Following the same reasoning, provisions in the Sydney Harbour Catchment REP allow that development consent is not required for the Proposal.

## 4.3 State Environmental Planning Policies

No State Environmental Planning Policies apply to the Proposal

### 4.4 Confirmation of Part 5 Position

All relevant statutory planning instruments have been examined for the Proposal. The Proposal would be for the improvement and repair of a road, therefore where the proposed works would be performed in Zone 4, the Employment Zone of the Parramatta LGA, development consent from Council is not required, due to adoption of the Model Provisions in the LEP 2001. Where the proposed works would be performed in Zone 4(c) the Industrial Enterprise Zone in the Auburn LGA, development consent from Council would not be required due to adoption of the Model Provisions in the LEP 2000. The Proposal is therefore assessed under Part 5 of the EP&A Act.

## 5.1 Strategic Planning

The Proposal would be funded by State Maintenance funds and is part of an ongoing commitment by the RTA to address road safety in accordance with the RTA's responsibilities for ensuring a maximum level of service to road users.

The Proposal would contribute to achieving the objectives set out in the NSW Government's integrated transport plan, *Action for Transport 2010* and the companion document, *Road Safety 2010. Road Safety 2010* is a strategy developed to help New South Wales move towards having the safest roads in the world and objectives include:

- Keeping the road network in good order;
- Getting the best out of our system; and
- Preventing accidents and saving lives.

This Proposal would contribute to the keeping the road network in good order and to achieving safety objectives. Remediation of the piles supporting the Bridge would create a safer road and therefore help the RTA achieve the objectives of *Road Safety 2010*.

## 5.2 Need for the Proposal

The Parramatta Road is a vital east-west link between the geographic centre of Sydney (Parramatta CBD) and commercial districts to the east. Parramatta Road is heavily trafficked and hosts, almost along the entirety of its route, industrial and commercial zones. It provides a link between the economic hubs of the Sydney CBD and the Parramatta CBD and hosts businesses and industry that offer services to the local community and to the wider communities of Sydney and beyond.

At present a total of approximately 40m² of pile surface area, representing approximately 20% of the total pile exposed surface area, is damaged. This is estimated to represent an increase in damaged area of 20% when compared to an investigation performed in 2000. Damage to the piles is primarily caused by corrosion due to chlorine ingress. The dominant deterioration mechanism for the superstructure elements is carbonation, however no corrosion damage is found on these elements.

The proposed rehabilitation works are considered a necessary maintenance procedure to prevent further damage to the pile surface area. Rehabilitation would ensure that the Bridge maintains a normal level of service, without load restrictions and would provide for continued use of Parramatta Road into the future. In lieu of the proposed works the Bridge piles would further deteriorate. This would increase ongoing maintenance costs and would decrease safety and serviceability. Restricted load limits on the bridge would compromise the amenity of the area. The Proposal would provide safer conditions to the public and would ensure that use of the Bridge continues without load restrictions.

# 6 Concept Stage

## 6.1 Proposal Objectives

The proposed works are informed by the strategic planning framework identified. The Proposal objectives are to:

- retain the social and economic amenity of the community into the future by rehabilitation the Bridge;
- address public amenity by improving road safety;
- maintain and enhance economic amenity for the future by improving a public asset;
- protect environmental amenity by rehabilitating crumbling elements of the Bridge that would otherwise contribute to water pollution;
- minimise and avoid detrimental impacts on environmental amenity through preparation and implementation of this REF; and
- minimise impacts upon road users and the local community during the proposed works.

## 6.2 Options Considered

#### Option I - Do Nothing:

The Do Nothing option would result in no works being undertaken to rehabilitate the deteriorated piles of the Bridge. The safety and amenity of the Bridge would further decrease over time as chlorine ingress continued to deteriorate the concrete piles. The Bridge would decrease in serviceability and would eventually be declared unsafe for certain loads. Load restrictions would be applied to the Bridge and this would result in increased delays or increased congestion of alternative roads where traffic would detour to. The Bridge would eventually be decommissioned from the road network due to safety concerns, compromising the existing east-west road link and impacting on the amenity of the area. This option does not address the RTA's commitment to keep the road network in good order, to prevent accidents and save lives and to perform ongoing maintenance and improvement of public assets.

#### Option 2 - Conventional Patch Repair and Coat

The scope of work for this option would include:

- Conventional patch repair to all existing areas of damage; and
- Application of coating system to all elements.

The coating system is expected to reduce the extent of further corrosion activity by limiting carbonation and/or chlorine ingress. However this option is not chosen as it would not prevent ongoing corrosion where corrosion has already occurred. This option would therefore require future and ongoing patch repair and re-application of coating, which would impose a high ongoing cost.

## Option 3 - Combination of Patch Repair, Cathode Protection and Coat

The scope of work for this option would include:

- Patch repair to all existing areas of damage;
- Installation of a cathode protection system to all piles;
- Application of coating system to the superstructure elements following conventional patch repair (if any).

Installation of the cathode protection system would mitigate corrosion by making the reinforcement act as a cathode rather than an anode, as it does when it corrodes. The effectiveness of the cathode protection system is not impacted by the amount of accumulated chloride ions around the reinforcement.

This option would limit any future damage to be minimal as the cathode protection system would prevent further corrosion including in those areas where corrosion has already begun.

# Option 4 – Combination of Patch Repair, Cathode Protection and Re-alkalisation The scope of work for this option would include:

- Patch repair to all existing areas of damage;
- Application of cathode protection system to piles; and
- Application of realkalisation to the superstructure elements, following patch repair to existing damage (if any).

This option was considered the best approach from a technical perspective, however it was not considered suitable due to:

- The high installation cost;
- The absence of damage to the superstructure elements; and
- The likelihood of superstructure reinforcement not being electrically continuous.
   This would not make realkalisation possible without making the reinforcement electrically continuous first.

## **Preferred Option**

# Option Three - Combination of Patch Repair, Cathode Protection System and Coat

Option Three is the preferred option as it is considered the most appropriate and cost effective long-term repair option for the Bridge.

# 7 Background Investigations and Consultation

## 7.1 Background Investigations and Database Searches

The following results were obtained from desktop database searches conducted for the study area. The information below provides a summary of the search results. Copies of all the search results are provided in Appendix B.

## Australian Heritage Database

A search of the Australian Heritage Database (AHD) on the 25th November 2005 and the 12th December, 2005 was performed for the Auburn and Parramatta LGAs. None of the items listed on the AHD are within the vicinity of the Proposal site. The nearest item is the Lower Duck River Wetlands located approximately 650m downstream from the Proposal site. These wetlands are described as containing a significant proportion of the mangroves remaining in the Sydney region and the oldest known stand of mangroves remaining on the Parramatta River. These wetlands are considered further in Section 8.4.

## **NSW** Heritage Office State Heritage Register/Inventory

A search of the State Heritage Register (SHR) was performed on the 25th November, 2005 for sites listed within the Auburn and Parramatta LGAs. A total of 7 and 68 items were found respectively, none of which are in the vicinity of the Proposal site. It is not anticipated that the Proposal would impact on any of these items or on any items listed on the SHR. These items are not considered further in this REF.

A search of the Inventory for the Auburn and Parramatta LGAs was performed on the 25th November, 2005 for sites listed within the Auburn and Parramatta LGAs. The search found a total of 103 and 1298 items respectively. The closest items listed as being located in the Auburn LGA are the Clyde Marshalling Yards, which are located approximately 350m south of the Proposal site and a Parramatta Milestone located on the southern side of Parramatta Road between the Duck River and Rawson Street. It is not anticipated that these items would be impacted by the proposed works. The closest items listed as being located in the Parramatta LGA are the Shell Oil Refinery Wharf located approximately 700m downstream from the Proposal site and Wetlands located along the Duck River. The proposed works would not require use of or impact to the Shell Oil Refinery Wharf and this item is not considered further in this REF. The Wetlands listing refers to mangroves growing within the Proposal site. The Proposal would involve harm to mangroves growing on the River banks. Impact upon the mangroves in this area is further addressed in Sections 8.4 and 9.2.

#### **Auburn Local Environment Plan 2000**

A search of Schedule 2 of the LEP was performed on the 12th December, 2005 for heritage items and heritage groups. No items of heritage significance additional to those addressed above were found within the vicinity of the Proposal site.

#### Parramatta Local Environment Plan 1996 (Heritage and Conservation)

A search of Schedules I, 2 and 3 of the Heritage and Conservation LEP was performed on the I2th December, 2005 for heritage items of state, regional and local significance and for heritage conservation areas. No items of heritage significance additional to those addressed above were found within the vicinity of the Proposal site.

## **RTA Section 170 Heritage and Conservation Register**

A search of the RTA Section 170 Heritage and Conservation Register was performed on 25th November, 2005 for listings within the RTA Sydney Region. None of the listed items are relevant to the Proposal and are not considered further in this REF.

## NSW DEC Aboriginal Heritage Information Management System (AHIMS)

The DEC AHIMS Register was searched on 20th December, 2005 for a 5km radius around the Proposal site. The search revealed a total of 62 Aboriginal objects and places within the locality, none of which are within the study area. The closest item is located approximately 1.25km south southwest of the Proposal site and represents the nearest of a conglomeration of 9 Aboriginal open camps located along the upper reaches of the Duck River. All other items are located greater than 1.5km away from the Proposal site. There is no potential for impacts upon the items listed upon the AHIMS Register as the works would not require excavations, earthmoving or change to landform at the areas listed. Impacts on these items are not considered further in this report.

#### NSW DEC Atlas of NSW Wildlife - Threatened Flora and Fauna Records

The DEC Wildlife Atlas Flora and Fauna records were searched for the Proposal site (including a 5km buffer) on 7th December 2005. Three threatened flora species were recorded in the vicinity of the Proposal site. The closest recordings are approximately 1.75km northeast and southeast of the Proposal site and are *Wilsonia backhousei* and *Acacia pubescens* (Downy Wattle).

The DEC Wildlife Atlas found 5 fauna records within the vicinity of the Proposal site. The closest record is of *Litoria aurea* (the Green and Golden Bell Frog) which has been recorded approximately 1.25km southwest of the Proposal site on the Duck Creek. The next closest recording is of *Dasyurus maculatus* (the Spotted Tailed Quoll) located approximately 1.75km south southwest. Flora and fauna are further discussed in Section 8.4.

#### **DEH Protected Matters (EPBC Act) Database**

The EPBC Act database was searched on the 25th November, 2005 for listed matters of National Environmental Significance known from within 5km of the study area. The results are summarised in Table I.

#### **NSW BioNet Database**

The NSW Fisheries databases were searched via the NSW BioNet database on the 25th November, 2005 for the Auburn and Parramatta LGAs. The search identified no records for threatened or endangered fish species.

#### **NSW DPI Noxious Weeds List**

The NSW Department of Agriculture Noxious Weeds list was searched on 12th December, 2005 for the Auburn and Parramatta control areas. In the Auburn control area 31 weed species are declared as noxious. In the Parramatta control area 47 weed species are declared as noxious. The following is based on weeds identified at the site during the site visit and may not be inclusive of all weeds present.

Weeds identified at the study area and declared as noxious within both the Auburn and Parramatta control areas include:

- Green Cestrum (Cestrum parqui) (W2);
- Lantana (Lantana camera) (W2); and
- Castor Oil Plant (Ricinis communis) (W2);

Weeds present at the study and declared noxious only within the Parramatta control area are:

- Balloon Vine (Cardiospermum grandiflorum) (W4c); and
- Morning Glory (*Ipomea indica*) (W4c).

The potential impact of the Proposal to spread noxious weeds is further discussed in Section 8.4.

#### **NSW DEC Contaminated Land Records**

The DEC Contaminated Land Records were searched on 25th November, 2005 for the Auburn and Parramatta Council LGAs. The records identified five sites in the Auburn Council LGA and eleven sites in the Parramatta LGA. The closest contaminated property to the Proposal site is located greater than 500m southwest of the Proposal site and would not be impacted in any way by the Proposal. Contaminated land is not discussed further in Section 8.2.

## **NSW DEC Air Quality Information**

The DEC Air Quality Information website was searched on the 13th December, 2005 for the nearest monitoring location, which is Chullora. The 24-hour air quality summary showed that all pollutant concentrations were within the standards set by the National Environmental Protection Measure.

#### The DEH National Pollutant Inventory

The National Pollution Inventory (NPI) was searched on 25th November, 2005 for air quality in the Auburn and Parramatta areas. The National Pollution Inventory indicates that air quality in the Auburn LGA is primarily affected by emissions from Public Order and Safety Services and from motor vehicles. Other significant sources in the area are from domestic/commercial solvents/aerosols, lawn mowing and motor vehicle refinishing. In all 44 pollution substances were found to be emitted from 31 sources. The major source, Public Order and Safety Services accounts for 27 of the substances identified including arsenic, benzene, beryllium, cadmium, chromium, cobalt, copper, dichloromethane, fluoride, hydrochloric acid, lead, mercury, dioxins and PAH's.

The National Pollution Inventory indicates that air quality in the Parramatta LGA is primarily affected by emissions from petroleum refining and from motor vehicles. Other significant sources in the area are from domestic/commercial solvents/aerosols, lawn mowing and motor vehicle refinishing. In all 43 pollution substances were found to be emitted from 29 sources. The major source, petroleum refining accounts for 20 of the substances identified including arsenic, benzene, beryllium, cadmium, chromium, lead, hydrogen sulphide and sulphur dioxide. Air quality is discussed further in Section 8.8.

## **DIPNR Acid Sulphate Soil Risk Mapping**

The Proposal site is located in an area that is recorded on the DIPNR Acid Sulphate Soil Risk mapping database as disturbed terrain with an elevation of greater than 4m AHD and is not assigned a risk category.

## 7.2 Government and Community Consultation and Involvement

#### 7.2.1 Government and stakeholder consultation

Relevant state government agencies and stakeholders were contacted and provided with the opportunity to comment on the Proposal. Table 2 lists the government agencies and stakeholders that were invited to comment on the Proposal for this REF. Responses received are summarised in column 1, while column 2 identifies the Section in the REF where addressed. Copies of all correspondences are provided Appendix 3.

## 7.2.2 Community Consultation and Involvement

Due to the small scale of the Proposal, no community consultation has been undertaken. However in accordance with the RTA's Community Involvement Practice Notes and Resource Manual, 1998 the affected community would be consulted prior to commencement of works.

#### 8.1 General

This section of the REF provides a detailed description of the potential environmental impacts associated with the Proposal during both construction and operation, and provides site-specific safeguards to ameliorate the identified potential impacts.

The environmental safeguards predominately outline additional site-specific requirements which are not covered by the RTA's QA Specifications – *Environmental Protection* (Management Plan) QA Specifications 35, Soil and Water Management (Erosion and Sediment Control Plan) QA Specification G39 and Clearing and Grubbing QA Specification G40 for inclusion into the Contractors Environmental Management Plan (CEMP) and the Project Environmental Management Plan (PEMP). These safeguards would be implemented prior to construction, during construction and post construction. The CEMP and PEMP would be reviewed by the RTA's Regional Environmental Adviser, Sydney Region prior to the commencement of work.

## 8.2 Landform, Geology and Soils

### **Potential Impacts**

The Proposal would involve disturbance to the banks of the River associated with gaining access and excavation of sediments within the River channel to install the ICCP.

The Proposal site is located within an area of disturbed terrain and the soils are largely comprised of imported fill of unknown composition. The unknown fill may include contaminated materials and the works could impact on acid sulfate soils (ASS) or contaminated sediments. Excavation also has the potential to generate contaminated spoil.

Release and transport of sediment could cause degradation of the existing environment by releasing contaminated material. These impacts would cause a change to the chemical and biological properties of the waterway which could impact the health of aquatic wildlife and flora including the Lower Duck River wetland assemblages located downstream from the Proposal site.

Trampling of the bank would disturb vegetation such as weeds (including noxious weeds), grass and Grey Mangroves. This could reduce the stability of the soil and increase the risk of erosion. If vegetation growing adjacent to the River edge was completely removed, including the roots, mass erosion including slumping could occur.

Erosion of the River bank would cause widening of the channel, transport of sediment and pollution of the waterway by turbid plumes. Transport of turbid plumes may be either to upstream or downstream areas due to the tidal nature of the River and would cause increased temperature and nutrient levels in the waterway. This would impact on the health of aquatic flora and fauna.

During construction there is a risk that loose concrete bridge elements and new material used for patching and coating of the Bridge elements could be released into the River. This material would pollute the River and could harm aquatic flora and fauna by increasing turbidity and altering the chemical composition of the waterway.

## Site Specific Safeguards

- An Erosion and Sedimentation Control Plan (ESCP) would be developed and incorporated into the CEMP. The ESCP would be prepared in accordance with Landcoms Managing Urban Stormwater: Soils and Construction. 4th edition March 2004 (The Blue Book). The ESCP would be reviewed by the RTA's Regional Environmental Adviser, Sydney Region prior to the commencement of works. As part of the ESCP, the sediment controls would be inspected and maintained daily and an auditable record of inspection and maintenance records kept and made available on site for review by any RTA personnel or Department of Primary Industries Fisheries Officer.
- Sediment controls (e.g. silt curtains and booms) would be utilised to ensure that turbid
  plumes of water do not leave the Proposal site. Sediment controls would be installed
  and operational before the start of works, would be utilised during construction and
  would not be decommissioned until any suspended sediments have settled.
- The silt curtains would extend from the creek bed to the water surface level with no gaps.
- The silt curtains would be large enough to contain the entire area of disturbance.
- The aperture of the silt curtain fabric would be small enough to restrict sediment from exiting the confined work area.
- Hardstand material or rumble grids would be implemented at entry and exit points of the Proposal site for vehicles to minimise the tracking of soil and particulates onto pavement surfaces.
- To protect the toe of the River bank from erosion, geotextile material would be fixed at the toe of the River bank and would be secured with metal pins. The material would be placed atop existing vegetation. Vegetation in this area would not be removed unless it is unavoidable. All geotextile material and metal pins would be completely removed at completion of the works. Alternatively a stable removable raised platform would be placed at the toe of the River bank and above the vegetation and mangrove pneumatophores. The raised platform would be utilised by all personnel when carting equipment to the underside of the bridge or when accessing the underside of the Bridge. The platform would be removed at the end of each working day and would be stored in the site compound.
- The access along the south-eastern River bank would be cleared and stabilised with gravel to reduce the likelihood of erosion.
- Rehabilitation of disturbed areas of the Proposal site, including the river banks and where mangroves are harmed, would be undertaken progressively as stages are completed. Disturbed areas would be restored to their natural shape at the completion of works and riparian plant species indigenous to the area would be used. Any stabilising matting or logs used would be made from rapidly biodegradable material e.g. coir.
- Removal of any riparian vegetation would be performed to least impact the River bank. Stumps would be left in-situ and would be levelled as close to ground level as possible.
- Before any excavation or disturbance to soil, potentially impacted soils and sediments would be sampled and tested in accordance with The RTA Guidelines for the Management of Acid Sulfate Materials (2005) to determine whether ASS are present. This investigation will also include analysis of potential contaminants in soils or sediments to be impacted or spoil that may be generated. An environmental management strategy should be prepared that provides appropriate management controls for any ASS or contaminated material that is identified. The management strategy would be prepared in consultation with the Regional Environmental Advisor, Sydney Region.
- No fill or excavated material would be stockpiled in flood prone areas or on slopes greater than 2H:IV. Stockpiles would be located 50m away from the high bank of any rivers or drainage lines and would be secure against the 1 in 10 year flood level.

## 8.3 Water Quality and Hydrology

#### **Potential Impacts**

The Proposal has the potential to release a range of contaminants into the River. These may include concrete material, coating material, cathode protection system material, fuels, oils and chemicals. Spillage of these potential contaminants may result from inadequate storage, from improper use or from an accident during use. Due to the tidal nature of the River, release of contaminants into the watercourse would cause degradation and pollution of both upstream and downstream areas, which include the Lower Duck River wetlands, recreational areas, fishing areas including Sydney Harbour and habitat for native fish, frogs, reptiles, birds and mammals.

Flooding may occur during the works. This is of particular hazard as the works would be performed within the River channel. Flooding during the works may endanger the safety of personnel, may cause damage to equipment and assets and may cause transport of pollutants to downstream areas.

There is potential that the Proposal would require use of a coffer dam to allow access to the Bridge structure. Use of a coffer dam would introduce a range of potential impacts that are not addressed in this REF.

#### Site Specific Safeguards

- An incident emergency spill plan would be developed and incorporated into the CEMP.
   The plan would include measures to avoid spillages of fuels, chemicals, and fluids onto any surfaces or into the River. An emergency spill kit would be kept onsite at all times.
- All staff would be inducted of the incident emergency procedures and made aware of the location of where the emergency spill kit would be kept.
- Should a spill occur during construction, the incident emergency spill plan would be implemented, and the Regional Environmental Adviser, Sydney Region contacted.
- All fuels, chemicals, and liquids would be stored within the stockpile area.
- Onsite refuelling and maintenance of equipment would be avoided.
- If onsite refuelling must be undertaken it would be within impervious bunded areas within the compound site or as a minimum the fuelling contractor would be required to have portable bunding and a spill kit.
- Where equipment has broken down on site and cannot be moved and maintenance must be undertaken on site then temporary bunding, catch trays and spill kits would be used.
- Vehicle wash down would not be permitted on site.
- Washing of construction equipment including cement chutes would not be permitted on site.
- Washing of concrete equipment would be performed off site in a designated bunded area. Excess concrete would be scraped off equipment and collected prior to being washed. All concrete residue would be collected and disposed of to a licensed landfill
- A containment device would be used during construction to prevent cement, coating materials and other construction materials from entering the waterway (e.g. drop sheets).
- Wastewater generated from the construction process would be contained onsite, collected via a suction pump or wet industrial vacuum and/or treated in accordance with DEC specifications prior to its disposal. The release of dirty water into any waterways would be prohibited.

- Concrete use would be carried out in a controlled manner to minimise spillage and/or overspray.
- All works would be performed at low tide only.
- A Flood Contingency Plan (FCP) would be developed and would be reviewed by the Regional Environment Officer, Sydney Region before commencement of works. The FCP would include but not be restricted to: a flood evacuation plan for personnel, equipment and the compound site, that weather forecasts would be periodically checked for flood warnings or high rainfall events and that all equipment would be stored securely.
- If it is identified that a coffer dam would be required, the Regional Environmental Advisor, Sydney Region would be informed and would assess the additional scope of works in consultation with DPI Fisheries.

## 8.4 Biodiversity

## **Potential Impacts**

The Proposal is not expected to impact any threatened flora or fauna species previously recorded or potentially occurring in the area. Eight threatened species listed on the TSC Act 1995 or the EPBC Act 1999 have been previously recorded as occurring within 5km of the Proposal site, however there have been no recorded findings of threatened species, populations or ecological communities within 1.5km of the Proposal site. It is not anticipated that any threatened flora species listed on the TSC Act 1995 or EPBC Act 1999 previously recorded or considered potentially occurring in the area would be impacted as a result of the Proposal.

#### Flora

The potential for the Proposal to cause harm to Avicenna marina (Grey Mangroves) would be determined subsequent to letting of the contract and when a detailed design is available. It is considered that, depending on the final scope of works, there is potential to cause damage by trampling of pneumatophores located on the River bank. Section 9.2 addresses the permit requirements for causing impacts to marine vegetation and safeguards are included below for implementation if it is determined the mangroves would be impacted.

The study area has been previously disturbed by filling of the landscape and from weed invasion. Whilst the Proposal does not involve clearing of vegetation, there is a potential to disturb a number of weeds listed as noxious in both the Auburn and Parramatta control areas. These include *Lantana camera* (category W2), *Cestrum parqui* (W2), *Ricinis communis* (W2), *Cardiospermum grandiflorum* (W4c in Parramatta control area only) and *Ipomea indica* (W4c in Parramatta control area only). Disturbance of these weeds has the potential to cause further spread and invasion along the River.

#### Fauna

A population of *Litoria aurea* (the Green and Golden Bell Frog) is known to exist on the Shell Refinery and CSR Emoleum Lands and within the Lower Duck River wetlands (DEC, 2005). This location is approximately 2km northeast of the Proposal site. Recordings of *Litoria aurea* are also recorded as occurring on the Duck Creek (as opposed to the Duck River) and located approximately 1.25km west southwest of the Proposal site. Potential impacts on the population located downstream from the Proposal site include impact on water quality due to sedimentation and possible use of herbicides to control weeds. This could impair tadpole survival and reduce the habitat quality of downstream areas. It is considered that these potential impacts are unlikely to occur due to the small scope of

works, the distance from the Proposal site and due to implementation of the safeguards listed in Section 8.2 and below.

A bird believed to be a Welcome Swallow (*Hirundo neoxena*) is observed nesting under the bridge. The nest is located under the bridge superstructure in the north eastern corner. This species is protected fauna under the *National Parks and Wildlife Act, 1974*. These birds and nest would be disturbed during the proposed works due to the presence of contractors and equipment under the Bridge and application of protective coating to the superstructure.

#### Aquatics

Snags located in the River potentially provide habitat for fish and other aquatic fauna. The Proposal would involve removal of snags and material from the Proposal site to allow access to the Bridge elements and installation of construction equipment including booms and silt fences. Removal of these snags from the River could reduce the habitat value of the area for fish and other aquatic species.

Booms and silt fences would be used to safeguard against release of sediment from the proposed works, however they may impede passage of fish within the River. This could reduce the health of affected fish by restricting, natural movements in relation to tidal flows, food source and other variables of the waterway and inducing stress.

The "degradation of native riparian vegetation along New South Wales water courses" is a Key threatening process under the Fisheries Management Act, 1994. The Proposal is not expected to cause degradation of native riparian vegetation present along the Ducks River.

## Site Specific Safeguards

#### Flora

- If category W2 noxious weeds including Lantana camera (Lantana), Cestrum parqui (Green Cestrum), and Ricinis communis (Castor Oil Plant) or category W4c noxious weeds including Cardiospermum grandiflorum (Balloon Vine) and Ipomea indica (Morning Glory) are identified within the Proposal site they would be removed in a manner that prevents spreading and in accordance with the Noxious Weeds Act, 1993.
- Any weed vegetation removed from the works would be taken to a licensed landfill facility and would not be used as mulch or mulched with other vegetation.
- A permit to harm marine vegetation under Sections 204 and 205 of the Fisheries Management Act 1994 would be obtained before start of the proposed works if it is determined upon receipt of the detailed design that mangroves or other marine vegetation would be impacted.
- The area of vegetation to be cleared would be restricted to the south-eastern bank of the River within the Proposal site. This area would be clearly marked onsite, and on the site plans prior to the commencement of works. Should additional vegetation removal be required, the RTA's Regional Environmental Adviser, Sydney Region would be contacted and consulted to determine the need for further environmental impact assessment.
- Any trimming of mature native trees (performed on marine vegetation only after obtaining a permit to harm marine vegetation under Sections 204 and 205 of the Fisheries Management Act 1994) would be undertaken by a qualified arborist.
- Vehicles and machinery would be parked in areas with existing sealed surfaces.
- Construction compounds, stockpile sites and the storage of materials would be established within areas with existing sealed surfaces.

• Trees and land that would not be disturbed would clearly marked by a fence or bright tape.

#### Fauna

- Any fauna species (e.g. Welcome Swallow) found inhabiting areas to be disturbed would be removed by a person suitably licensed under the NPWS Act 1974 (e.g. a WIRES volunteer).
- Any control of weeds within the Proposal site that may be performed in conjunction with the local control authority upon consultation (refer to flora safeguards above) would not involve the use of glyphosate based herbicides such as *Round Up®* and *Round Up Biactive®* to which the Green and Golden Bell Frog is expected to have acute toxicity (Mann and Bidwell, 1999)

#### Aquatic

- Woody debris in the Proposal site would be relocated upstream and downstream of the
  proposed works. Debris comprised of anthropogenic rubbish would be removed from
  the waterway and disposed of at a licensed landfill. To minimise habitat disturbance, any
  snags and debris relocated within the River would not be moved again after completion
  of works.
- The Proposal would be undertaken in accordance with NSW Fisheries Fish Habitat Protection Plan No. I General.
- Any fish caught within the booms and silt fences must be immediately released downstream of the Proposal site, except carp which would be removed from the waterway where possible.

#### 8.5 Noise

Noise levels in the Proposal site would potentially increase during construction as a result of equipment including air compressor, power tools (electric saws, drills, grinders, vibratory hammers), various hand tools, barges, scaffold, water pump, truck and utility and concrete trucks and pump. The nearest receptors are industrial premises and the Proposal site is located within an area of high traffic volumes, including heavy vehicles.

While noise associated with the Proposal would be expected, the location of the Proposal site underneath a Bridge would minimise impact. The proposed works would be performed under the Bridge. Noise created would be buffered by the concrete underside of the Bridge, by the east and west abutments which consist of stone retaining walls and by the earthen and vegetated River banks. Any noise escaping the Proposal site would be further buffered against the background of existing traffic noise.

Whilst it would be expected that construction activities would add to the immediate noise catchment, the catchment does not contain any noise sensitive receivers. Additionally, it would be expected that construction noise would largely be masked by the high existing ambient noise levels.

There would be no increase to the existing noise levels at the Proposal site after completion of the proposed works.

## Site Specific Safeguards

- Should works be required outside standard working hours, the procedures contained in the RTA's *Environmental Noise Management Manual, 2001 "Practice Notes vii Roadworks Outside of Normal Working Hours*" would be followed.
- Potentially affected businesses would be contacted prior to the commencement of works and would be informed of the proposed works, working hours, and the period of construction. Residents would also be provided with a contact name and number should any complaints wish to be registered.
- The idling of machinery and equipment when not in use and for prolonged periods of time would be prohibited.
- Noisy activities if required, would be carried out during the day, or early in the evening if required to be undertaken at night.
- All machines would be in good working condition, with particular attention to exhaust silencers, engine covers and other noise reduction devices.
- Vehicle movements including loading and unloading would be minimised and would occur before 10pm.
- Noise management strategies would be developed with consideration to the estimated construction noise criteria of 65dBA.
- Any noisy plant associated with construction equipment including generators, would be located within a shielded position where possible.

### 8.6 Air Quality

### **Potential Impacts**

The Proposal has a minor potential to deteriorate the local air quality during maintenance works as a result of equipment and vehicle emissions and from dust from the minor vegetation removal and concrete restoration activities.

No change in operational air quality is expected, as the existing use of Parramatta Road would be maintained.

Exposure to concrete dust can be detrimental to health if precautions are not taken. Silica dust is a component of concrete dust and is a result of silica sand used to make concrete. Breathing of silica dust can cause scarring of the lungs and subsequent stiffening of the lung tissue which can lead to difficulty in breathing and lung disease including silicosis, bronchitis and lung cancer.

It is anticipated that these potential impacts upon air quality are limited due to the scope of the Proposal. The amount of concrete dust created is anticipated to be a small and would be controlled through the implementation of the safeguards outlined below.

### Site Specific Safeguards

- Any stockpiles and general areas with the capacity to cause dust would be dampened to suppress dust emissions.
- Any materials transported in trucks would be appropriately covered to reduce dust generation.
- Construction activities that generate high dust levels including use of power tools to clean the damaged concrete pile area, would be avoided during high wind periods.
- Ventilation of the Proposal site would not be impeded to facilitate works.
- Safety devices would be provided to workers in accordance with AS/NZS 1716 Respiratory Protective Devices and AS/NZS 1715: Selection, Use and Maintenance of Respiratory Protective Devices during concrete removal activities.
- Keep exposure to dust as low as is practicable.
- Concrete dust would be collected, stored and transported in specially designed agitator bowls and then transferred to a final mould while in plastic state.
- To minimise exhaust emissions, vehicles and equipment used on-site would be switched off when not operating.

### 8.7 Visual Amenity / Landscape

### **Potential Impacts**

There is likely to be a moderate, short-term decrease in visual amenity during the construction period. This would be due to the presence of construction equipment at the Proposal site.

The Proposal would increase the visual amenity of the Bridge over the long-term by rehabilitating the crumbling bridge piles which currently mar the appearance of the Bridge.

Attachment of a digital remote control and monitoring system would alter the appearance of the Bridge.

### Site Specific Safeguards

- Disturbed areas would be revegetated and landscaped.
- The construction site would be kept tidy and rubbish free.
- Works would be completed as soon as possible and all equipment removed from the Proposal site.
- The digital remote control and monitoring system would be placed in a discrete location as is possible considering access requirements.

#### 8.8 Socio-economic Considerations

### **Potential Impacts**

The Proposal is designed to enhance the socio-economic amenity of road users and the local community over the long-term by rehabilitating the Bridge to ensure that normal, safe service can continue without the need for load limits or other restrictions. During the period of works however there is potential for short-term impacts on the socio-economic amenity of road users and the local community. These impacts are expected to be minimal due to the small scope of the proposed works.

The Proposal has the potential to cause short-term impacts to traffic flow when construction equipment is transported to and removed from the area under the Bridge via Parramatta Road. This impact is expected to be minimal, would be restricted to short time periods and would not cause closure of traffic flow in either direction.

If there is a requirement for night works, the use of lights would not impact on any residences due to none being located within the vicinity of the Proposal site.

#### Site Specific Safeguards

- Access or alternative access to residential and/or commercial properties would be maintained at all times.
- A Traffic Control Plan would be prepared in accordance with the RTA's Traffic Control
  at Work Sites Manual 2003, and approved by the RTA prior to implementation. The
  Traffic Control Plan would include the notification of any traffic alterations or closures.
- Public access, both vehicular and pedestrian would be retained over the bridge during the proposed works.

### 8.9 Waste Minimisation and Management

### **Potential Impacts**

Waste that may be recycled at a recycling facility licensed for that waste may include:

waste oils and liquids from construction equipment.

Waste that could be re-used for other purposes include:

excess construction material.

Other wastes that would require disposal at a licensed waste facility may include:

- concrete waste;
- noxious weed material;
- contaminated or potential acid sulphate soil and
- general waste such as rubbish.

The amount of concrete waste generated would not exceed 2 tonnes and thus an Environmental Protection License under the *Protection of the Environment and Operations Act, 1997* (POEO Act) would not be required for storage or transport.

### Site Specific Safeguards

- A Waste Management Plan would be prepared in accordance with RTA's QA Specifications and in accordance with RTA's Waste Minimisation & Management Guidelines, 1998 and the principles of the WARR Act.
- Native vegetation removed would be chipped and used as mulch in revegetation works.
- All noxious weeds and exotic plant species removed would be bagged and disposed of at a licensed landfill facility.
- All construction materials and wastes generated from the Proposal would be stockpiled and stored at the compound site prior to reuse, recycling or disposal.
- All working areas would be maintained, kept free of rubbish and cleaned up at the end of each working day.
- Wastes would not be stored for long periods during construction of the Proposal.
   Empty drums of fuels, oils or chemicals and fluids would not be stored on site during construction.

In addition, the Resource Management Hierarchy principles of the WARR Act would be adopted as follows:

- 1. Avoid unnecessary resource consumption as a priority;
- 2. Avoidance is followed by resource recovery (including reuse of materials, reprocessing recycling, and energy recovery; and
- 3. Disposal is undertaken as a last resort.

## 8.10 Summary of Beneficial Effects

The Proposal has the following beneficial effects:

- Realisation of goals presented in the broad long-term safety framework for NSW, Road Safety 2010.
- Rehabilitation of a public asset.
- Improving the long-term serviceability of the Bridge into the future

# 8.11 Summary of Adverse Effects

The Proposal would result in some adverse effects that would include:

- Short-term increase in noise and decrease in visual amenity during the construction period.
- Potential short-term blockage of fish passage during the duration of works.
- Short-term impact to marine vegetation including trimming of mangroves and trampling of pneumatophores.

## 9.1 Summary of Proposed Environmental Safeguards

Environmental safeguards outlined in this document would be incorporated into the detailed design phase of the Proposal and during construction and operation of the Proposal. These safeguards would minimise any potential adverse impacts arising from the proposed works on the surrounding environment. All safeguards described in this REF and the Decision Report/ Conditions of Approval would be incorporated into the Contractor's Environmental Management Plan (CEMP) and the Project Environmental Management Plan (PEMP).

The CEMP and PEMP (if required) would be developed in accordance with the specifications set out in the RTA's Environmental Protection (Management Plan) QA Specifications 35, Soil and Water Management (Erosion and Sediment Control Plan) QA Specification G39 and Clearing and Grubbing QA Specification G40

- The access along the south-eastern River bank would be cleared and stabilised with gravel to reduce the likelihood of erosion.
- Rehabilitation of disturbed areas of the Proposal site, including the river banks and where mangroves are harmed, would be undertaken progressively as stages are completed. Disturbed areas would be restored to their natural shape at the completion of works and riparian plant species indigenous to the area would be used. Any stabilising matting or logs used would be made from rapidly biodegradable material e.g. coir.
- Removal of any riparian vegetation would be performed to least impact the River bank. Stumps would be left in-situ and would be levelled as close to ground level as possible.
- Before any excavation or disturbance to soil, potentially impacted soils and sediments would be sampled and tested in accordance with The RTA Guidelines for the Management of Acid Sulfate Materials (2005) to determine whether ASS are present. This investigation will also include analysis of potential contaminants in soils or sediments to be impacted or spoil that may be generated. An environmental management strategy should be prepared that provides appropriate management controls for any ASS or contaminated material that is identified. The management strategy would be prepared in consultation with the Regional Environmental Advisor, Sydney Region.
- No fill or excavated material would be stockpiled in flood prone areas or on slopes greater than 2H:IV. Stockpiles would be located 50m away from the high bank of any rivers or drainage lines and would be secure against the I in I0 year flood level.

# Water Quality & Hydrology

- An incident emergency spill plan would be developed and incorporated into the CEMP. The plan would include measures to avoid spillages of fuels, chemicals, and fluids onto any surfaces or into the River. An emergency spill kit would be kept onsite at all times.
- All staff would be inducted of the incident emergency procedures and made aware of the location of where the emergency spill kit would be kept.
- Should a spill occur during construction, the incident emergency spill plan would be implemented, and the Regional Environmental Adviser, Sydney Region contacted.
- All fuels, chemicals, and liquids would be stored within the stockpile area.
- Onsite refuelling and maintenance of equipment would be

### **Environmental Safeguards**

- A permit to harm marine vegetation under Sections 204 and 205 of the Fisheries Management Act 1994 would be obtained before start of the proposed works if it is determined that mangroves or other marine vegetation would be impacted.
- The area of vegetation to be cleared would be restricted to the south-eastern bank of the River within the Proposal site. This area would be clearly marked onsite, and on the site plans prior to the commencement of works. Should additional vegetation removal be required, the RTA's Regional Environmental Adviser, Sydney Region would be contacted and consulted to determine the need for further environmental impact assessment.
- Any trimming of mature native trees (performed on marine vegetation only after obtaining a permit to harm marine vegetation under Sections 204 and 205 of the Fisheries Management Act 1994) would be undertaken by a qualified arborist.
- Vehicles and machinery would be parked in areas with existing sealed surfaces.
- Construction compounds, stockpile sites and the storage of materials would be established within areas with existing sealed surfaces.
- Trees and land that would not be disturbed would clearly marked by a fence or bright tape.

#### Fauna

- Any fauna species (e.g. Welcome Swallow) found inhabiting areas to be disturbed would be removed by a person suitably licensed under the NPWS Act 1974 (e.g. a WIRES volunteer).
- Any control of weeds within the Proposal site that may be performed in conjunction with the local control authority upon consultation (refer to flora safeguards above) would not involve the use of glyphosate based herbicides such as *Round Up®* and *Round Up Biactive®* to which the Green and Golden Bell Frog is expected to have acute toxicity (Mann and Bidwell, 1999)

### Aquatic

- Woody debris in the Proposal site would be relocated upstream and downstream of the proposed works. Debris comprised of anthropogenic rubbish would be removed from the waterway and disposed of at a licensed landfill. To minimise habitat disturbance, any snags and debris relocated within the River would not be moved again after completion of works.
- The Proposal would be undertaken in accordance with NSW Fisheries Fish Habitat Protection Plan No. I General.
- Any fish caught within the booms and silt fences must be immediately released downstream of the Proposal site, except carp which would be removed from the waterway where possible.

## 9.2 Licences and Approvals

### Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997

Should the Proposal involve the pollution of water such as to cause any chemical, biological or physical change to the existing water quality, an Environment Protection Licence would be sought from the DEC under the POEO Act 1997.

In addition the contractor and the RTA are obliged to notify the DEC when a "pollution incident" occurs that causes or threatens "material harm" to the environment.

### NSW Fisheries Management Act, 1994

A permit would be acquired from DPI Fisheries if the final design of works would temporarily or permanently block fish passage under Section 219 of the *Fisheries Management Act 1994*. Blockages include silt fencing across waterways for sediment erosion control and bunding and dewatering works during the construction of crossings (NSW Fisheries, 2003).

A permit would be acquired from DPI Fisheries under Sections 204 and 205 of the *Fisheries Management Act 1994* if the final design of works would cause harm to marine vegetation (e.g. mangroves).

The *Fisheries Management Act 1994* through the Fish Habitat Protection Plan No. I, requires public authorities, including local government and state authorities, to notify the Minister for Fisheries of any Proposal to remove or relocate woody debris.

Permits may also be required under Part 5 (Clauses 112-115) of the *Fisheries Management* (*General*) Regulation 2002 for works which may involve the use of electrical devices or other dangerous substances within waters.

# 10 Consideration of State and Commonwealth Environmental Factors

# 10.1 Clause 228(2) Factors (NSW Legislation)

The factors which need to be taken into account when considering the environmental impact of an activity are listed in Clause 228(2) of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation, 2000.* Those factors have been addressed in Table 4 below to ensure that the likely impacts of the proposed activities on the natural and built environment are fully considered.



The Lower Duck River wetlands are one of eight significant remnant wetlands listed on the Register (Ermington Bay/Mud Flats, Meadowbank Park Foreshore, Yarralla Bay, Majors Bay, Mason Park, Homebush Bay and Haslems Creek). These were once part of an extensive wetland system bordering the Parramatta River. Mangroves of the Parramatta River area represent a significant proportion of the mangroves remaining in the Sydney Region. Lower Duck River supports the oldest known stand of mangroves remaining on the river. The uncommon species, small pig face (LAMPRANTHUS TEGENS), occurs at Lower Duck River. The remnant wetlands of the Upper Parramatta River provide habitat for a diverse bird community; seventy-five species have been recorded of which thirtyseven species occur regularly. It also provides breeding habitat for seventeen species. The remnant wetlands of the Upper Parramatta River have been ranked sixth in importance for waders in New South West and provide habitat for a large number of species listed in the Japan Australian Migratory Birds Agreement (JAMBA) twenty species and China Australia Migratory Birds Agreement (CAMBA) nineteen species. Two species which occur in the area, the little tern (STERNA ALBIFRONS) and the black tailed Godwit (LIMOSA LIMOSA) are listed under Schedule 12 (Endangered Fauna) of the NSW National Parks and Wildlife Act (1974).

Official Values: Not Available

Description:

Duck River, a major tributary of the Parramatta River, drains a large catchment of 45sqkm of flat land containing extensive residential, commercial and industrial areas to the southwest and south before joining the Parramatta River just west of Silverwater Road Bridge. The wetlands include several areas alternating on the west and east sides of Duck River upstream to its junction with Duck Creek. Mangroves occur along the length of this part of Duck River with the two most extensive stands near its mouth on the western side and upstream on its eastern side. Saltmarshes occur adjacent to the mangrove stands, including an extensive area of land adjacent to the River associated with an oil refinery. The saltmarsh vegetation in this area is characterised by a complex mosaic with species distribution determined by surface microtopography.

# History: Not Available Condition and Integrity:

Lower Duck River previously supported extensive wetland complexes of which only remnants remain due to land reclamation and loss of land through the construction of stormwater drains. The present mangrove vegetation is of varied condition with the vegetation in some areas having died or been cut down. In many areas, rubbish accumulated amongst the mangroves gives the area an unpleasant appearance. However, the existing mature mangrove stands are generally healthy and vigorous and are actively regenerating by seedling establishment.

#### Location:

About 15ha, between Rosehill and Silverwater, comprising the areas identified as wetlands or mangrove regeneration, in Sydney Regional Environmental Plan No 22, Map Sheet 6, which abut that River or Duck Creek.

I am writing in response to your recent inquiry in respect to Aboriginal objects and Aboriginal places registered with the NSW Department of Environment and Conservation (DEC) at the above location.

A search of the DEC Aboriginal Heritage Information Management System (AHIMS) has shown that 62 Aboriginal objects and Aboriginal places are recorded in or near the above location. Please refer to the attached report for details.

The information derived from the AHIMS search is only to be used for the purpose for which it was requested. It is not to be made available to the public.

The following qualifications apply to an AHIMS search:

- AHIMS only includes information on Aboriginal objects and Aboriginal places that have been provided to DEC;
- Large areas of New South Wales have not been the subject of systematic survey or recording
  of Aboriginal history. These areas may contain Aboriginal objects and other heritage values
  which are not recorded on AHIMS;
- Recordings are provided from a variety of sources and may be variable in their accuracy.
   When an AHIMS search identifies Aboriginal objects in or near the area it is recommended that the exact location of the Aboriginal object be determined by re-location on the ground; and
- The criteria used to search AHIMS are derived from the information provided by the client and DEC assumes that this information is accurate.

All Aboriginal places and Aboriginal objects are protected under the *National Parks and Wildlife Act* 1974 (NPW Act) and it is an offence to destroy, damage or deface them without the prior consent of the DEC Director-General. An Aboriginal object is considered to be known if:

- It is registered on AHIMS;
- It is known to the Aboriginal community; or

• It is located during an investigation of the area conducted for a development application.

If you considering undertaking a development activity in the area subject to the AHIMS search, DEC would recommend that an Aboriginal Heritage Assessment be undertaken. You should consult with the relevant consent authority to determine the necessary assessment to accompany your development application.







- non-threatened seabirds which have only been mapped for recorded breeding sites;
- seals which have only been mapped for breeding sites near the Australian continent.

Such breeding sites may be important for the protection of the Commonwealth Marine environment.





Granville Estate Pty Ltd (ACN 087 203 549), the "recipient", must maintain remediation action in accordance with the requirements set out in this Notice.

Previous voluntary remediation agreement number 26003 dated 1 December 1999 has been issued on the recipient under s26 of the *Contaminated Land Management Act 1997*.

1. Land to which this notice applies ("the land")

This notice applies to the land located at 2B Factory Street, Granville, being the whole of Lot 1 DP 1012953, and currently occupied by the recipient.

### 2. Commencement of maintenance of remediation

This notice takes effect from the date of this notice and continues in force until it is otherwise varied or revoked.

3. Maintenance requirements

The EPA requires the recipient to maintain the following remediation action in relation to the land:

### (a) Groundwater monitoring

- Conduct sampling and analysis of groundwater for lead, copper and zinc and prepare
  monitoring reports on a three monthly basis, commencing from the date of this Notice, for five
  years until September 2005 from the three bores as indicated in the Report titled "Site
  Management Plan, 2B Factory Street Granville, Prepared for Trafalgar Corporate" by Thiess
  Environmental Services dated April 2000.
- Ensure that the sampling, analysis and reporting is consistent with the guidelines made or approved by the EPA under s105 of the *Contaminated Land Management Act 1997*.
- Report to the EPA within 2 weeks of detection of levels of copper, lead and zinc in groundwater above the criteria of ANZECC 1992 Australian Water Quality Guidelines for Fresh and Marine Waters for the protection of aquatic ecosystems.

### (b) Maintenance of the containment cell

The owner/occupier of the land must not undertake any work, or cause, permit or allow the undertaking of any work which would result in:

- the erection of any building or structure on the land; or
- any disturbance that would compromise the integrity of the containment cell to effectively contain the contaminants;

unless the prior written approval of the undertaking of the EPA has been obtained and the work is undertaken in accordance with any requirements of that approval.

(c) Engagement of a site auditor

The recipient must engage a site auditor accredited under the *Contaminated Land Management Act, 1997* to review the requirements as stated above in 3 (a) and (b) and provide, at the end of the 5 year monitoring period, a site audit to the EPA outlining the need, if any, for further groundwater monitoring and commenting on the performance and maintenance of the containment cell.

### 4. Notification of change of owner/occupier

At least 30 days prior to the recipient selling, transferring, leasing or otherwise relinquishing responsibility for the land, the recipient should give written notification to the EPA confirming the name of the prospective owner or occupier.






Map of Auburn, NSW



NSW Department of Primary Industries requests that the following be included in the REF for the above project.

- If marine vegetation will be harmed, including mangroves, seagrass, macroalgae. Any such works will require a permit to harm marine vegetation from this Department. Harm includes trimming mangrove trees, as well as complete removal.
- Details of the construction of the coffer dam, a time-frame for installation and removal, the construction materials to be used and the method of removal. Clean fill or sheet piling must be used to construct the dam. Contaminated material, building and demolition rubble or acid sulphate soils (ASS) must not be used as fill in any aquatic environment.
- Provisions to protect fish during the dewatering process for the coffer dam, must be in place. This should include:
- Any fish caught in the dewatering process must be immediately released downstream of the site, except carp which should be removed from the waterway where possible.
- Pumps and screens must be large enough, and pump velocities slow enough, to allow fish to escape during the dewatering process.
- Environmental safeguards (silt curtains, booms etc) must be in place before, and utilised during, construction of the works to ensure there is no escape of turbid plumes into the aquatic environment. Work is to be undertaken at low tide. Sediment controls must not be removed until the site has settled following construction. Screens or other guards should be carefully removed after the work is completed and all of the sediment has settled on the bottom. Sediment or silt screens should be inspected daily, and maintained to prevent the escape of suspended sediments.
- Fill or excavated material must not be stockpiled in flood prone areas in order to minimise sedimentation. Particular care should be made in siting stockpiles and dumps. Preferred sites should be situated either above mean high water mark, or be secure from a 1 in 10 year flood level and have effective sediment control works to contain any runoff.

Area must be rehabilitated after completion of works.
